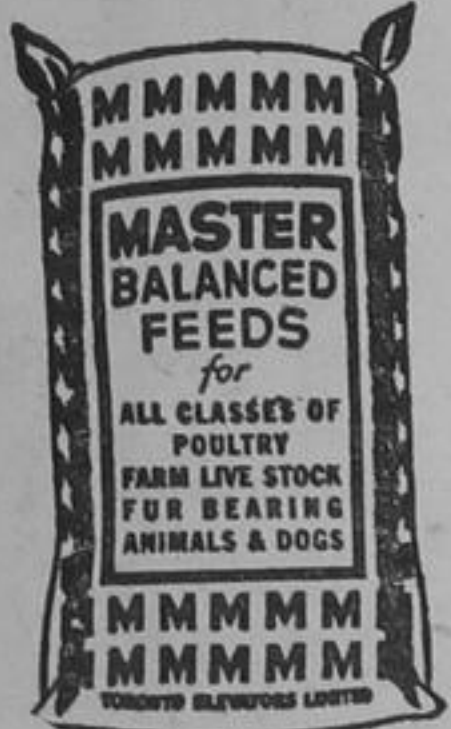

Bert Ireland

The late Bert Ireland of Teston, whose remains rest in Maple Cemetery, was born on the eighth line of King Township 78 years ago and was the youngest of a family of fourteen children born to George and Sarah Ireland. He was a thresher in his younger days, using the old steam engine equipment.

In 1921 he started the first bus service from King City to Toronto, with a terminal at Vaughan Road and St. Clair Avenue, then the outskirts of the city. At first he only operated in summer months. He carried on this service for seven years, then sold out and bought a trucking business, which he ran until ill health forced him to give it up.

He married Jane Browlee in 1897 and they lived in the same house at Teston for over fifty years. Besides his widow one son, Albert E. of Toronto, and two daughters, Mrs. M. Aness (Katherine) Woodbridge, and Mrs. G. Watt (Mae) Thistleton, survive. There are three grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

The annual ratepayers' meeting of Carrville Public School S. S. No. 3 Vaughan was held in the school on Wednesday evening, Mr. Brian Bailey was chairman and Mr. Gilbert Whittamore secretary for the meeting. There were 26 parents present. Mr. Bill Ferguson gave the treasurer's report, also the inspector's report of the teacher and these were approved. It was decided that the insurance be increased by \$3,000. Considerable discussion took place on the enlarging of the school or a new school. Mrs. Miller moved, seconded by Mrs. Bailey, that the trustees call a meeting with the inspector or anyone who would and could give any information to clarify the accommodation of Carrville School as soon as possible.

Mr. R. Miller moved, seconded by Mr. Roy Baker, that the teacher's salary be increased \$200 from January to June.

Moved by Mrs. Middleton and seconded by Mrs. Miller that the caretaker receive an extra \$5 a month for January, February and March. The resignation of Trustee Bill Ferguson was accepted, due to the fact he leaves the community in the spring.

Election of trustees saw Mr. Jack Barton elected for two years and Mr. Brian Bailey for three years. A vote of thanks was given to Mr. Bill Ferguson for his work and time given in the interests of the school.

E. P. Quantz

Eugene Percival Quantz, a highly esteemed citizen of Richmond Hill died in Toronto General Hospital Monday, January 1, after a few hours illness. He was suddenly stricken with a heart attack in the early morning hours and was immediately taken to the hospital where he passed away about six o'clock.

The late Mr. Quantz was born on the second of Markham, in the year 1876, a son of Arthur Quantz and Margaret Linklater, of United Empire Loyalist stock. His family was one of the first four families to settle in the township and the crown deed of the property was in possession of the family until the death of his parents in 1922.

He farmed on the second of Markham until the farm was expropriated for the Toronto Jail Farm, and worked there as farm manager until the property was taken over by the Ontario Government in 1939, at which time he retired on pension.

A resident of Richmond Hill since 1914, he built his late residence on Roseview Avenue in that year, when there were but three houses on the street.

In recent years he has engaged in carpentry work and was widely known and highly respected by all with whom he came in contact.

He was married to Alice Langstaff McDonald, who survives, also two brothers, Karl in Winnipeg and Elmo in Belle Ewart, and one sister, Mrs. Ella Bird of Toronto.

The funeral was held from his late residence Wednesday afternoon and the service was conducted by Rev. C. B. Brethen of Richmond Hill United Church. Interment was in Richmond Hill Cemetery, the pall bearers being R. Cutance, Bert Cook, Fred Hoover, Morley Hall, William Tyndall and W. B. Clark.
