**New Sunday School Plan**  
At a meeting of Thornhill United Church Junior Congregation leaders, Sunday School teachers and Nursery leaders held Tuesday, December 26, 1950, it was decided in spite of the limited accommodation, to inaugurate a new programme beginning the first Sunday in January. This will integrate the separate programmes into one complete unit, allowing for a more intensified programme and greater efficiency.

Letters will be mailed to the parents explaining the plan. In the meantime, it is sufficient to say that the Nursery for 2 and 3 year olds will be housed as usual in the kitchen. All other children will join in the worship of the church: the 4 to 11 group will retire early for their programme and classes in the Sunday School Hall; the 12 to 14 group will be dismissed just prior to the sermon and will go to the Vestry for class discussion, joining later with the others in the closing exercises; and this united programme will be known as Sunday School.

The other age groups are taken care of through the Young People's Union and the Adult Fireside Group.
