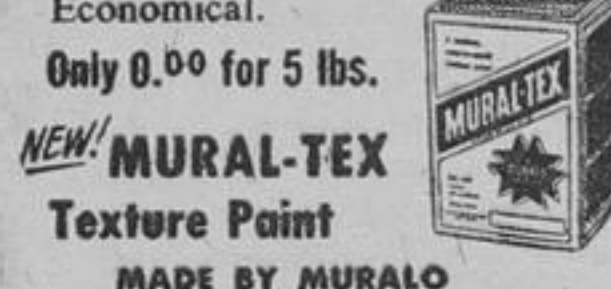
**Establish Scout H.Q. in Newfoundland**
