# County Health Unit Work Reported On By Director

(The following is a report covering the activities of the York County Health Unit, of which the village of Richmond Hill and the townships of Markham and Vaughan are members, for the month of December. It has been submitted by Dr. Robert M. King, Director. A statement covering the activities for the unit for the half-year in which it has been in existence will be submitted in the near future. EDITOR)

Our small staff of Public Health Nurses was further reduced this month by the resignation of Mrs. Orma Gibson who has been serving the Township of Vaughan and the Villages of Richmond Hill and Woodbridge. Continual efforts are being made to obtain more Public Health Nurses to bring our staff up to reasonable strength, and the vacancy left by Mrs. Gibson will be filled by the first new Public Health Nurse whom we may obtain. It is of considerable concern to the people within the Health Unit that the drastically small staff of Public Health Nurses be increased from the present number of three full-time field nurses to at least seven full-time field nurses at the earliest opportunity. At the present time, each nurse is extending her work and efforts over an area of considerable size and population and thus she is not able to give as complete a service to the people as is desired. The demands for her services is increasing and it is hoped that the demand will be met as soon as possible.

According to outside reports, measles is occurring in epidemic proportions, both in Hamilton and in Toronto, and it is expected that we will have a great many cases of measles within the York County Health Unit during the next two to three months. During the month of December, a considerable number of cases were reported to the Health Unit by physicians, teachers and parents. The reporting of communicable diseases in general is improving greatly due apparently to an improved appreciation on the part of the public that it is important for the health of the community as a whole that the Medical Officer of Health have knowledge of where, when and how communicable diseases are occurring. It is impossible for any Health Department to take adequate steps to prevent illness if the Health Department does not know of existing cases of communicable diseases.

With the beginning of 1951, each monthly report will present the actual number of reported cases of communicable diseases. With the end of December 1950, complete plans for immunization of school children, preschool children, and infants has been made. With the presentation of this report, the immunization program has actually been in operation for a couple of weeks. All school-age children, with their parents' consent, are given an opportunity to be immunized against Diphtheria, Tetanus (Lockjaw) and Smallpox. If they have previously been immunized, they are given an opportunity to have reinforcing doses to maintain their protection against these diseases.

At the same time throughout the Health Unit area, immunization is being offered to infants and preschool-age children from the ages of approximately six months up to school age. Parents are thus able to protect their young children at an early age, when protection is most valuable, against Diphtheria, Tetanus (Lockjaw), Whooping Cough and Smallpox.

The present immunization program represents a tremendous effort on the part of the staff of the Health Unit and the schedule has been tightly drawn up with the excellent co-operation of teachers and school authorities in order to make it possible to visit each school within the York County Health Unit by the first week of June, 1951.

During the month of December 1950, inspections of restaurants, lunch counters and other eating establishments took up a considerable portion of the inspectors' time. Throughout the Health Unit, the inspectors made 128 visits to various food-handling establishments during December. There is no doubt that a great deal of work has to be done in order to improve the sanitation in most of the eating establishments in all Municipalities in the Health Unit. A large amount of this work is a matter of starting at scratch, to demonstrate to operators of restaurants and lunch counters general methods of maintaining clean and sanitary establishments. It is necessary in many cases for the operators to obtain certain new minimum equipment in order to do a reasonable job. Emphasis on restaurant sanitation will be placed primarily on dish washing, food and dish handling, food storage, and sanitary serving of food to the customer. While there is a great deal of improvement to be made in restaurants in this regard throughout the entire Health Unit, it is expected that full co-operation of the restaurants' operators, who themselves desire to operate a healthy and clean establishment, will begin to show noticeable improvements in the very near future.

Routine inspections of milk producers' farms have continued during December, and 43 visits to such farms were made during the month, with 58 samples of raw milk and 20 samples of pasteurized products being examined at the Provincial Laboratories.
