**Safety Measures Being Taken  
At School, Ratepayers Advised**

School crossing strips are to be painted on Yonge St. at Oak Ridges school, it was disclosed in a letter from Major Alex Mackenzie, member of the Ontario Legislature for North York read at the meeting of the Oak Ridges - Lake Wilcox Ratepayers Association on Monday night.

Regretting his inability to be present because of the fact that the Ontario house was in session, Major Mackenzie also said that the Department of Highways was prepared to go along with Whitchurch and King Townships and pay 50% of the cost of sidewalks from the school to the King side road. President E. L. McCarron of the association drew attention to the new type of warning sign which had been erected near the school recently.

A proposal to reduce fees for the balance of the association's fiscal year caused some discussion but failed to find a seconder.

**Red Cross Outposts  
Act As Lighthouses  
For Men In Distress**

Many a life has been saved because of the faithful light burning in the lighthouse . . . but in this case the light house keeper's life was saved by the Red Cross.

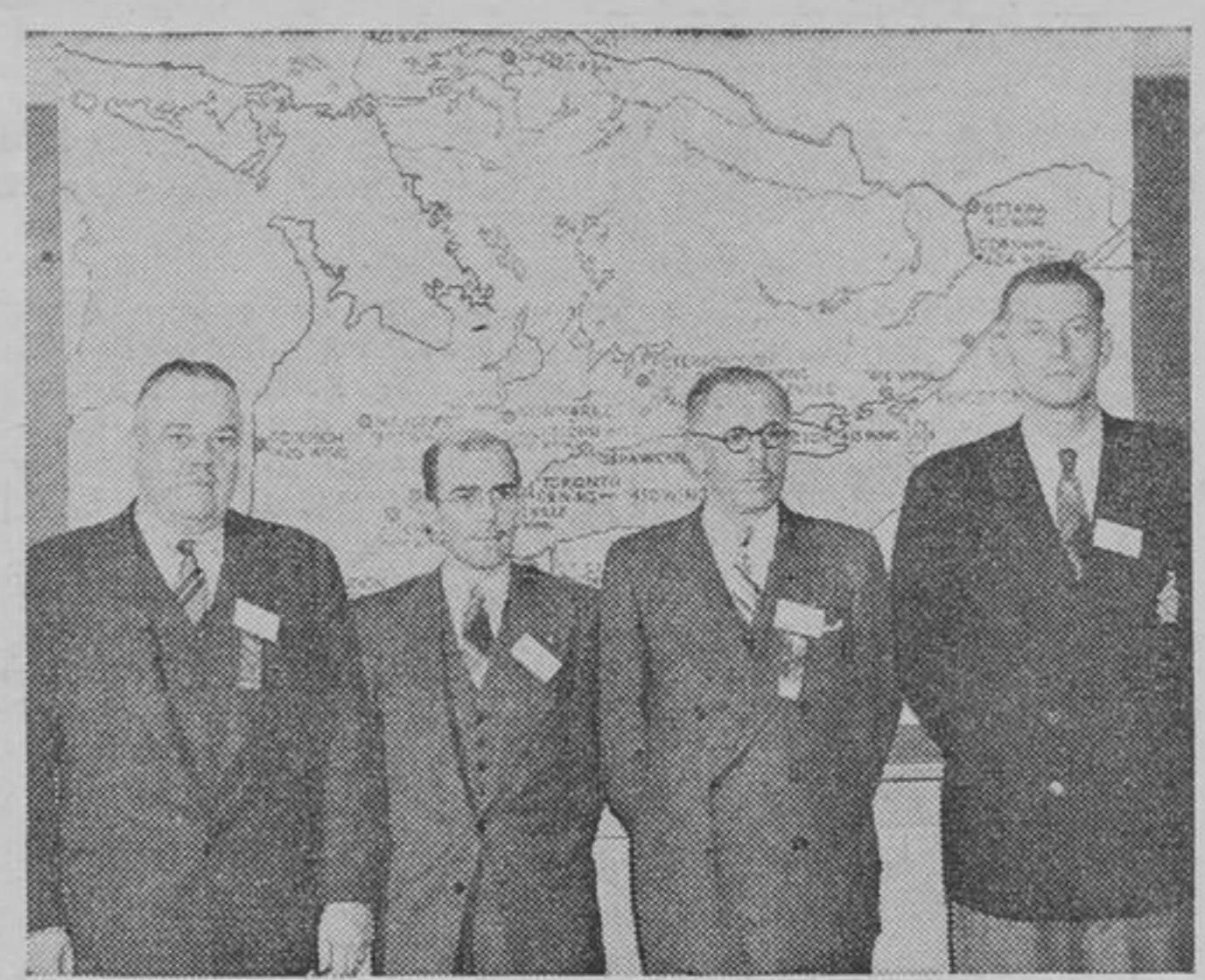
It happened on the lonely island of Clapperton in Lake Huron. The lighthouse keeper, William Baker, was awakened one night by a severe pain in his right side. He tried to get up to go and signal for help from the tower, but he couldn't move. For three days he lay there not caring if he lived or died, then suddenly he remembered the light. The oil was running low and soon there would be no light to guide the ships through the darkness. He made a superhuman effort, dragged himself out of bed and attempted to crawl the 30 or 40 yards to the lighthouse. He collapsed with pain while still several yards from his goal. Five hours later a friend rowed up to the lighthouse to return a borrowed article. He took the sick man to Kagawong, on the northern shore of the Manitoulin Island, and then by car to the Red Cross hospital at Mindemoya. Doctors there performed an emergency operation.

Just as the lighthouse is a beacon of hope to ships sailing the dark uncharted waters, so the Red Cross Outpost Hospitals are a ray of hope to the people living in remote and isolated sections of the country.

Reeve Neal also thanked the Lions Club and accepted the resuscitator on behalf of the Village Council. Councillor Ken Tomlin, Chairman of the Fire Department Committee also expressed the village's appreciation.

Lion Doug Boyd reported on the serious illness of a Richmond Hill resident and appealed to the Club for blood donors to replace the blood taken from the blood bank for his transfusions. Lion Wally Burnie, Albert Hill, Don Little, Ted Mansbridge, Bill Turner and Jack Hart all volunteered.

Lion Hugh MacKay introduced David Hogg, who was the pupil chosen from the Richmond Hill High School to visit New York and the United Nations at the expense of the Lions Club.
