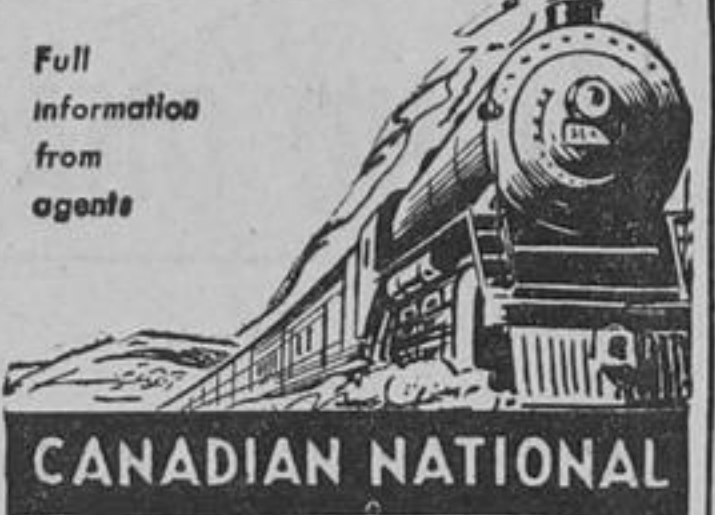
Some ardent fishermen went north last week for smelt fishing. Some very fine fish were caught.
