THE LEGIONNAIRES

Branch 375
Canadian Legion, B.E.S.L.
Richmond Hill

1st Vice President Comrade J. D. Sanders of Branch 375 was head of a delegation from Richmond Hill at Zone E-2 meeting held at Newmarket April 15, for the purpose of Election of Officers. Comrade Bert Phelps retiring Zone E-2 Commander and Deputy District E Commander declined re-nomination for the office of Zone Commander. A highly interesting and important ceremony was carried out by the Richmond Hill Colour Party with the "Marching on" and "Depositing of Newmarket Branch No. 425 flags in proper positions in front of the Legion Hall.

An Executive Meeting of both the branch and Ladies Auxiliary was held at the home of President Comrade Steve Arbon, May Ave., on April 18, with a good attendance and the keen interest shown; everything points to definite progress.

The Legion's Role

At a meeting held in Ottawa on 26th February, 1951, attended by representatives of the Canadian Legion, the St. John Ambulance, the Boy Scouts Association and the Civil Defence Co-ordinator, the Canadian Legion agreed to undertake the following role with respect to planning and operation of civil defence programmes:

- Representation on provincial and municipal advisory councils.
- Provide personnel for control centres. Ex-Service Staff Officers could be used to great advantage as controllers and deputies.
- Provide wireless instructors and operators.
- Ex-Service personnel who have undergone intelligence training would be valuable in the intelligence sub-section of Headquarters Section.
- Wardens — men or women selected because of leadership and ability, and not apt to become emotionally disturbed. War service will count.
- Rescue section, hard work and dangerous — ex-servicemen have necessary qualifications.
- Engineer section — handling of heavy types of engineering equipment — salvage work — decontamination — collection and burial of the dead.
- Ambulance section — role much the same as the ambulances attached to field dressing station. Ex R.C.A.S.C. ambulance drivers as well as ex-medical people.
- Auxiliary police and fire services.

2. The above represents activities for which the Canadian Legion is well equipped in most communities. There may be other activities in which they are prepared to co-operate to the fullest of their ability.

3. The foregoing statement provides the broad framework within which the Canadian Legion are prepared to participate in the development and operation of civil defence programmes. Specific tasks which the Canadian Legion may undertake in planning for civil defence or in implementation of those plans, will be developed within this framework by the local Civil Defence Authority and the appropriate Executive body of the Canadian Legion.
