THE LEGIONNAIRES

Branch 375 Canadian Legion, B.E.S.L. Richmond Hill

Members please note: The next business meeting of Branch No. 375 will be on Tuesday, May 8. A full program of sports and coming events that will be of interest to all are in the process of planning. The executive are anxious to have the fullest co-operation of its members.

The District E Convention of the Canadian Legion B.E.S.L. to be held at St. Brant, Ont., May 20, includes 44 branches with colour parties. A truly impressive and important event. Any of the members who desire to attend please notify committee in charge of arrangements as Richmond Hill Branch 375 will definitely be represented.

Last week the Commons established a 31-man veteran's committee, its first in three years and got from Veterans' Minister Lapointe a review of the legislation to come before it.

To Opposition members who expressed fear that the Government means to apply the means test to the Pensions Act he gave assurance that the administration has no such intention.

The legislation he forecast will do these things: 1. Give members of the Army's Special Force, as an interim measure, some but not all of the discharge benefits accorded veterans of World War II. This will be the policy until a "clearer picture" is obtained.

2. Provide up to \$40 a month for unemployed married pensioners and up to \$20 a month for unemployed single pensioners to help them meet rising living costs. This will be in addition to regular pensions, which can go as high as \$125 a month for married men and \$94 for single.

3. Increase benefits for children of pensioned widows. A widow now gets \$75 a month for herself plus the usual pensioner's children's allowance of \$19 for the first child, \$15 for the second and \$12 for others. Orphans get twice these allowances. Mr. Lapointe did not detail the new proposals.

4. Encourage higher education for pensioners' children. This might be done by extending to 21 the age to which the children's allowances can be continued while they are studying. At present, they end at 16 for boys and 17 for girls.
