Richmond Hill Places Second In Track Meet At Newmarket

Sweeping up 32 firsts in the 46-event program, Aurora High School track and field team swept to a resounding triumph in Newmarket last Wednesday. The team retained its hold on the Eckhart Trophy emblematic of North York High School supremacy. Aurora amassed a total of 261 points, Richmond Hill nosing out Newmarket for second place with 123 points against a Newmarket count of 111.

All individual championships were nailed down by the Aurora team. Senior boys' champ was Ross Linton with 20 points, boasting victories in 100 and 220 yard runs, running broad and standing broad jumps. Ken Geer was inter-mediate winner with triumphs in discus, running broad and hop, step and jump for a 15-point total. Ron Geddes collected 18 points via victories in high jump, hop, step and jump plus 2 seconds and an equal number of thirds to capture junior honors.

Gaye Morning copped the senior girls' crown with firsts in the high jump and 75-yard dash and a second in standing broad jump for 13 marks. Grace Hoare was inter-mediate queen with 13 points, turning in two firsts and a third. Nancy Beckwith completed the Aurora sweep, putting together two firsts for 10 points to walk off with junior girls' honors.

Five new records were established by Jim Loblaw (Aurora) in 220 intermediate run. Bud Youngberg (R.H.) in the junior pole vault, and Robert Dick in the junior standing broad jump. 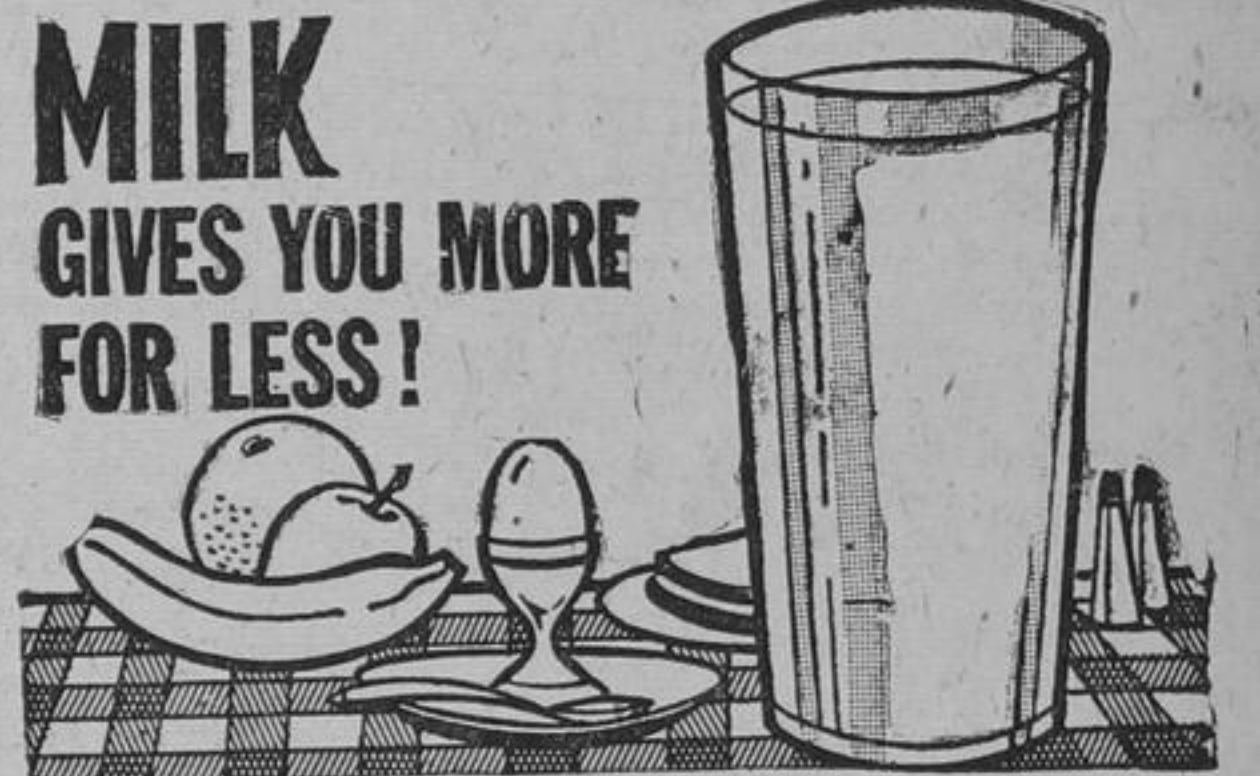

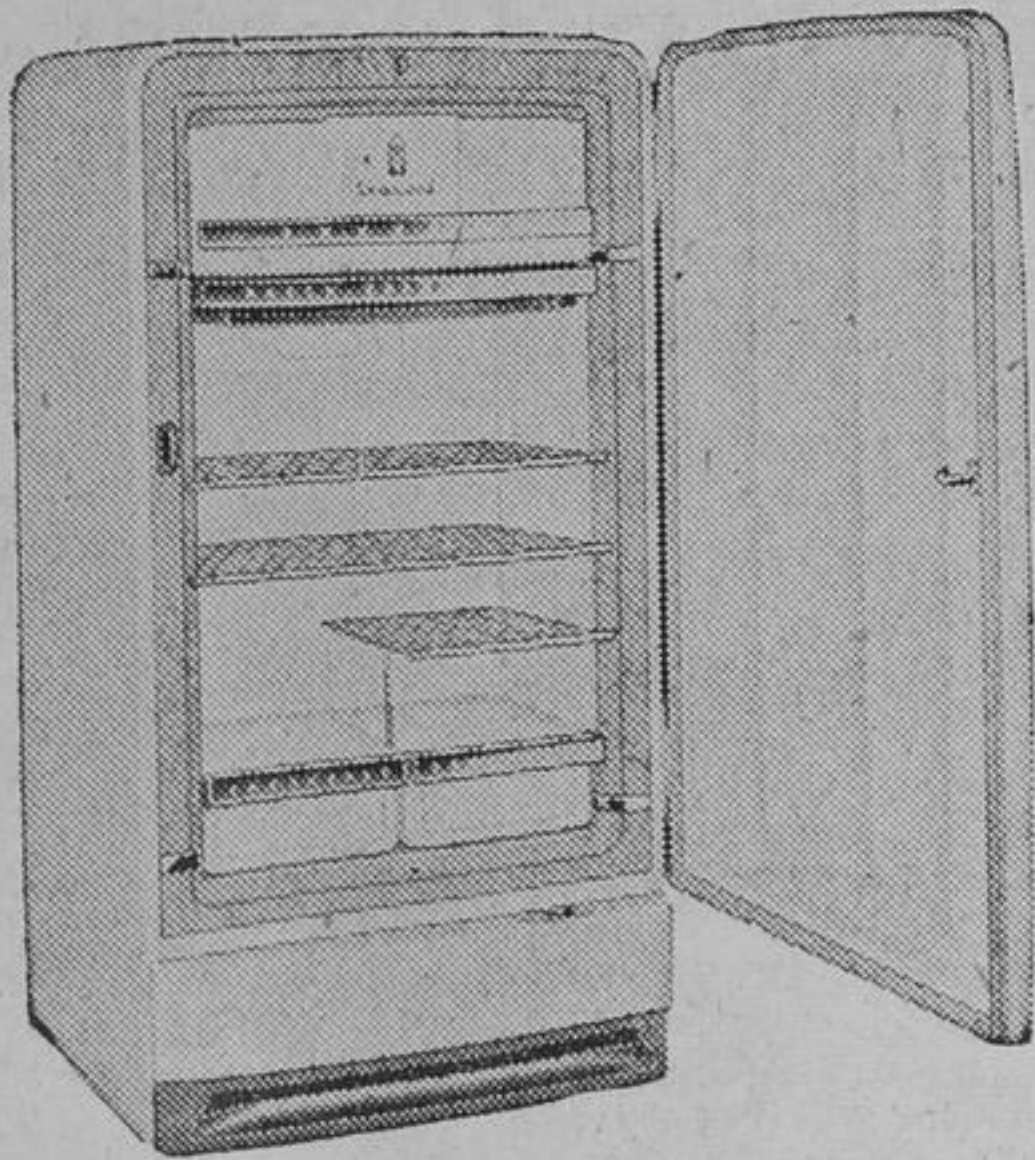
