Walk on the left side of the road (if there is no foot-path).</li> <li>3. Stop, look, and wait before you cross any road.</li> <li>4. Be easy to see; stay clear of parked cars; at night, wear or carry something white.</li> <li>5. On bicycles, remember, good riders take no chances.</li> <li>6. In cars, help — don't bother the driver.</li> </ol>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>FOR MOTORISTS</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. On trips, start early to avoid hurry and confusion.</li> <li>2. Take it easy; speed and hurry cause many accidents.</li> <li>3. The "right of way" at an intersection is no excuse for careless driving.</li> <li>4. Expect unpredictable moves when you see children on foot or on bicycles.</li> <li>5.
