Machinery Damaged In Markham Tp. Fire
Markham Township's storage building just north of Municipal Offices took fire at 9.15 p.m. on Friday, July 13th, with several pieces of machinery being damaged. Township Assessor J. A. Fleming and Albert Reesor noticed the fire at the time of starting, with the result that the Agincourt Fire Brigade, contacted immediately, was able to control the fire from the start.

The oldest machine, the Adams grader was damaged and it is not expected that it will be usable again. The sprayer also in the building can be reconitioned for further use. A privately owned truck was also damaged, with the repairs left to the owner. Two other township trucks and two graders were not in the building at the time. Sundry contents such as tools were burned and will need repairing before use again.

The cause of the fire is not yet known.


