The women of the village of
Mosivena are going to get their
tractor from the Women's Insti-
tute Branches of Ontario. Out of
a fund started last fall \$2,700 has
been forwarded for the purchase
of food and the remainder will be
used to buy the tractor and other

ova reported that Canadian dona-
tions of money and supplies aid-
ing war-injured children of Euro-
pe almost reached the \$300,000
mark in 1951, and said Ontario

contributors. The report also re-
