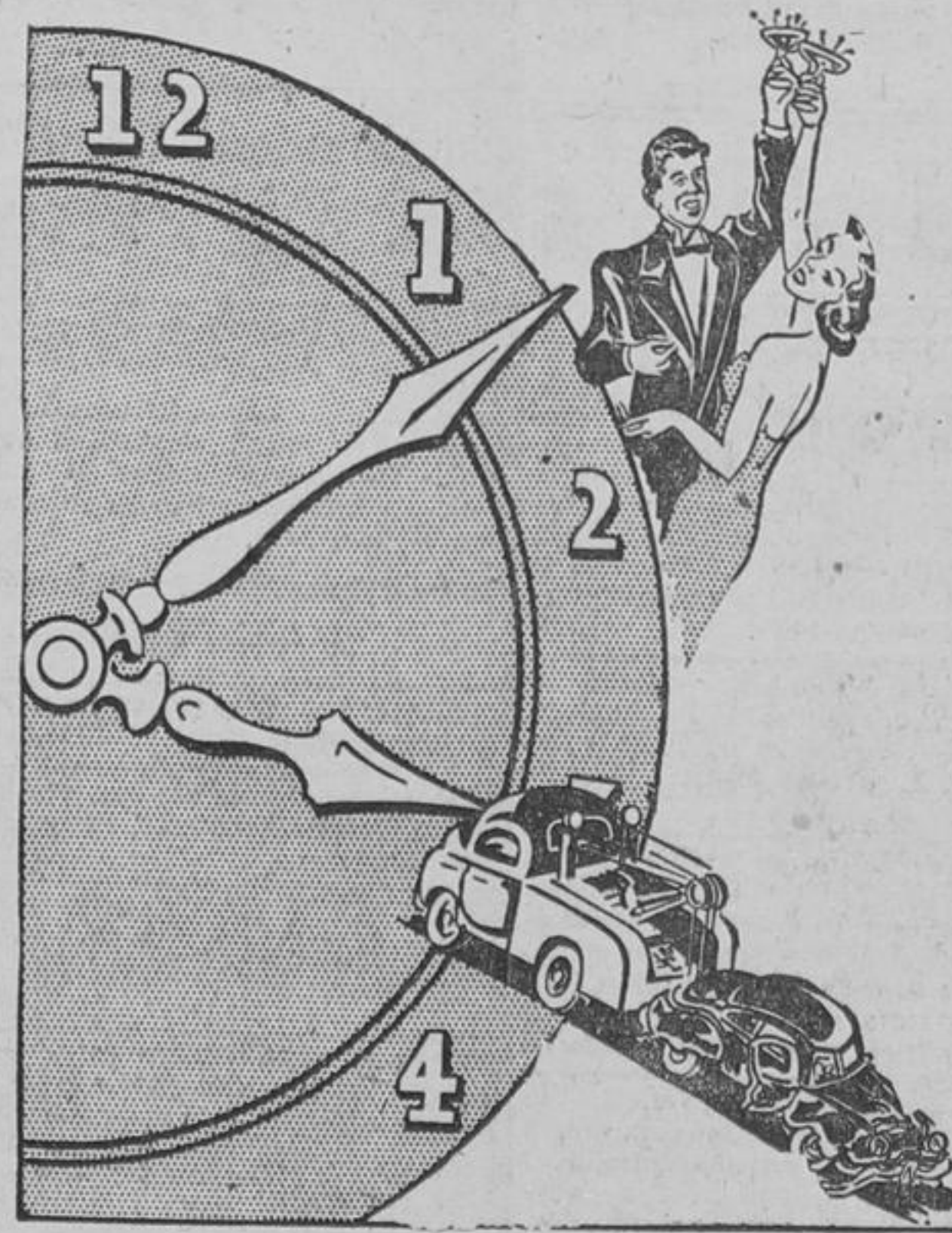

Maple leaves were the favorite theme in the quilt patterns which had to be original designs for competing branches. Other designs were the trillium, Ontario's flower, and pink and green English roses. Manitoulin districts had three winning entries, one a green map of the island one the emblem, the orchid and another the Shamrock-rose-thistle pattern. One branch quitted an Institute meeting scene bordered with brown teapots, another Canadian scene complete with Peace Tower Mounties had representatives in costumes of various nationalities.

The branch members have been planning and working on these quilts for the past year, the winning entries will be on exhibition in various fall fairs, some sold, others as in former competitions will be sent to Dennon College, W. I. institution in England. Bethesda branch, East York district was the winner in the district, but lost out in the finals.
