# Local War Memorial Dates Back To August Of 1923

The local War Memorial in Richmond Hill situated directly in front of the Public School was dedicated with all the pomp and ceremony connected with such an historic event on the afternoon of Sunday, August 5, 1923.

The 127th Battalion Band, Toronto, participated in a parade led by two little girls from the Orange Home. The order of this parade being the two little girls, the band, Village Council, Board of Education, Agricultural Society, local cadets, Oddfellows, Orange Order, Knights of Columbus and the returned veterans from Richmond Hill.

**Unveiling and Dedication**  
Lt. Col. Clarke, D.S.O. and Bar, York Rangers unveiled the impressive memorial to the seven young men Harold Rowley, Earle R. Hughes, Clelland Caldwell, William Case, Wellington C. Monkman, Arthur Cooper, and S. McMahon, from Richmond Hill, who paid the supreme sacrifice in World War I, and the 89 Richmond Hill boys who went overseas. In his unveiling address Col. W. N. Ponton, Belle-

ville, declared "that those to whom this was dedicated had exemplified the Empire's watchword - manhood. They are the immortals, we are the transients".

The late J. A. Greene acted as Master of Ceremonies. Parents of four of the fallen men Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Monkman Mr. and Mrs. George Caldwell, Mr. and Mrs. J. Hughes and Mr. and Mrs. C. Cooper were present and laid wreaths on the newly dedicated memorial. **Elaborate Memorial**  
The memorial, an elaborate one, is in the form of an octastyle colonnade, and is built of grey stone. Eight columns support the entablature which is semi-circular in shape. On six panels on the base are cut the names of six of the men who paid the supreme sacrifice. Several broad stone steps lead up to a small stone terrace at the base of the monument. Directly in front of these steps is a German trench mortar on a stone base. At one end of the colonnade stands a massive block of stone supporting a flagpole. On the stone is inscribed the names of those who served in the War.

## Assessor's Report

### King Township Population And Assessment Is On The Increase

The assessment rolls for 1953 were confirmed by Ed. Reddick, King Township assessor at \$5,530,450, when the Reeve, Elton J. Armstrong, and the King Township council held their regular monthly meeting on Monday, November 3, 1952.

**1000 More Population**  
In 1952 the population of King township is 7,148 and this is an increase of 1,000 since 1951. Even so, in the year 1880 the population of this township was larger than it is today. In those days there were numerous mills, lumber mills,

saw mills, woollen mills, etc. where men were employed. When the railroad went through the villages, the young men left the district and travelled to Bruce and Grey counties and to the wheat farms of the prairies.

**Court of Revision**  
A Court of Revision was sworn in by the township clerk, Harold Rose and only four small claims were received. The claim of Mr. and Mrs. James Reid, Toronto, that their cottage, north of Temperanceville was taxed \$8 too high was rejected. The claim of Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Fernier that their assessment of \$450 included a trailer, which has now been removed, was allowed. Two claims from Oak Ridge Park were re-assessed back to C. J. Meadows.

## Splendid Average Of \$502 At Annual Maple Uuit Sale

The second annual sale of artificially bred Holsteins conducted by the Maple Cattle Breeders' Association which operates an Artificial Breeding Unit at Maple, was a splendid success with 33 head bringing \$16,562 for a general average of \$502. The sale was held October 28 at the Hays Sales Arena, Oakville. Sixteen milking females averaged \$533; 14 bred heifers \$432; 2 heifer calves \$328 and one open yearling \$220.

**\$700 Tops For The Day**  
The good average was achieved without any exceptionally high prices to bolster it. Top for the day was \$700 paid by W. S. Hall, Oakville and J. E. Houck, Burlington to Wm. McGriskin, Jr., Agincourt, for Pluto Texal Beauty, a three year old daughter of Lonelm Texal Highcroft. The \$700 figure was reached again when Fred Hutchinson, Malton, paid \$700 to Orville F. Watson, Burlington for a four-year-old daughter of Lonelm Texal Antony.

Heifer calves sold exceptionally well and a baby daughter from the \$700 Wm. McGriskin heifer went at \$300 to Pickard & Clark, Acme, Alta.

## Quiet Hallowe'en In Markham & Vaughan

Police Chief Clarence Wideman of Markham township reports that Hallowe'en night throughout the township was comparatively quiet with the exception of the 8th and 9th concessions. On these two concessions three youths, all in their early 20's were apprehended by police after they had allegedly knocked down 12 mail boxes. As yet no charges have been laid, but it is expected they will be charged with malicious damage.

Over in the neighbouring township of Vaughan Police Chief Ernest Bone reports that Hallowe'en night was very quiet with nothing more serious than a few minor pranks customary to the occasion being reported. Mr. Bone stated his department received no complaints from irate residents or reports of damage.
