Oldest Woman In York Cty. Dies

Believed to be the oldest woman in York County, Mrs. Anna M. Sutherland of Newmarket passed away on Tuesday in St. Michael's Hospital at the age of 104.

Mrs. Sutherland was considered well on the way to recovery after a serious operation. She was the oldest patient in the hospital's history.

A mild-mannered woman and one who believed in moderation of thought and deed, Mrs. Sutherland took a vital interest in community and world affairs and was quite active in her own home until recently.

Mrs. Sutherland was born in Inverness, Scotland, coming to Canada as a child, she first lived in Dundas. Her father died and she moved to Newmarket with her mother, Anna Simpson. Mrs. Simpson brought Robert Simpson to Canada and encouraged him in the enterprise that finally became the Robert Simpson Co. Ltd.

Mrs. Simpson and her daughter were prime movers in the founding of the Presbyterian congregation at Newmarket. Anna Simpson, the daughter, married James Sutherland, who died in 1921.

Mrs. Sutherland leaves a daughter, Mrs. Ruby Cody of Toronto; a brother in law, R. F. Sutherland, who was speaker of the House of Commons under Sir Wilfrid Laurier; one grandson, Donald, and three great grandchildren.

SNOW WHITE AND THE SEVEN DWARFS, DISNEY MUSICAL, CLAIMS NEW HONORS

High drama, pathos, excitement and music are woven into Walt Disney's feature-length production, the famous "Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs," which is now being welcomed back to the screen to repeat its triumphs of several seasons ago.

The story is that of the oppressed heroine of the Grimm Brothers' fairy tale, of whose beauty the Queen is so jealous that she retreats to her dungeon laboratory to brew spells against Snow White. Then in the guise of a Witch, she makes a victim of Snow White after tracing her to her refuge among the hospitable Seven Dwarfs. Excitement becomes redoubled when the Dwarfs (Dopey, Sleepy, Grumpy, Bashful, Happy, Sleepy and Doc) chase the Witch into the mountains where, just as she is about to roll a great boulder down upon them, a bolt of lightning takes care of the situation.

The Dwarfs, believing Snow White is dead after her experience with the Queen, build a glass coffin for their friend, small animals and birds taking turns guarding it. But romance comes along in the person of a young Prince. He kisses Snow White, breaks the spell, and the two ride away to happiness.

All the original hit songs remain in this big feature production which is re-released by RKO Radio in color by Technicolor. The numbers are "Some Day My Prince Will Come," "Snow White," "I'm Wishing," "Whistle While You Work," "One Song," "Heigh-Ho," "The Dwarfs Yodel Song," "Bluddle-Uddle-Um-Dum" and "With a Smile and a Song."

Use Slow Oven For Xmas Fowl

For a golden brown turkey on Christmas Day use a slow oven, says Miss Margaret Myer, Home Economist of the Women's Institute Branch and Home Economics Service, Ontario Department of Agriculture.

Singe and remove any stray pin feathers, then wash the bird inside and outside. Sprinkle the neck and body cavities with salt and the bird is ready for the dressing. Use your favourite dressing but about three quarts will be needed for a 12-lb. turkey. Pack the dressing in loosely because it expands during roasting. Turkeys should be stuffed just before roasting. Never stuff a turkey the night before.

The bird is trussed to give it a neat, trim appearance and now it's ready for that slow oven.

325° F. Place the bird breast down on a rack in an open pan without water. Grease the skin to prevent it from becoming dry and tough. Or, cover the bird with a piece of cheesecloth dipped in melted fat. The bird may be basted frequently with the drippings in the pan.

A meat thermometer is the best test for doneness. "When the bird is done, a thermometer placed inside the thigh next to the body should read 190° F. You can also tell if the meat is done when the drumstick can be moved up and down easily. The meat feels soft when the thickest part of the drumstick is pressed with the fingers. Use paper toweling or cloth to protect your fingers. A 12-lb. turkey will take four or more hours to cook.






