ent. They are one of the few remaining countries with a sovereign as the head of state. After nearly fourteen years of war and postwar hardships, they are hoping for a renewal of power and prosperity under a second "Good Queen

The word "coronation" comes from the Latin word "corona" meaning a crown. It is a solemn public ceremony of placing a crown upon the head of a king in token of his sovereignty. This is a very old custom which Christian nations have adopted from Jewish history. Their kings were crowned by the high priest in the temple. History tells us of many kings who had no respect for God or his church. Britain can be very proud of the personal character of her last two kings. Similarly, she is very proud of Queen Elizabeth the Second. The first Christian monarch to be crowned by a priest was Leo I, Emperor of the East in 457

at Scone. The last Scottish ceremony was the coronation of Charles II in 1651. We have all heard much about the Stone of Scone According to tradition this was the stone used by Jacob as a pillow at Bethel. It was taken to Ireland where it became known as the "Lia Fail", which means the "Stone of Destiny". It was placed in Cashel Cathedral and was the coronation

in 843. He removed the Stone of Destiny to Scone. There it was kept and used as the coronation seat of the Scottish kings until 1296 when Edward I took it to Westminster. The chair of St. Edward was made with a receptacle for the Stone of Scone underneath it. All succeeding English sovereigns have used it. This St. Edwards chair will be used again in June for the coronation chair at the crowning of Elizabeth. It is a squat rough chair fracked with masses of initials which generations of pranksters have carved

Coronations used to take place immediately after a sovereign succeeded to the throne. Now it is usually delayed for a time. This allows for a suitable period of mourning for the former monarch. More elaborate plans can be made for this great event. It still usually takes place within twelve months after accession.
