TOWNSHIP OF MARKHAM BY-LAW NUMBER 1428

A by-law to amend by-law 1386 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARKHAM:

1. That by-law number 1386 be and the same is hereby amended by adding in paragraph 3 thereof after the words "residential: a one family residential dwelling" the following sentence:

"A dwelling erected prior to the date of the passing of this by-law may be used as a two family residential dwelling provided that each family dwelling unit has a floor space of at least 700 square feet and the lot upon which the dwelling is situated has a minimum area of 20,000 square feet."

2. This by-law shall come into effect on the day it is passed by council subject to the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.
