

## Two Truck Drivers Killed In Head-On Crash, Don Mills Rd.

Henry Leask, 55, of Uxbridge and Albert Galbraith, 42, of Newtonbrook, were instantly killed when two gravel trucks met head on on the Don Mills Road at 1.50 p.m. last Monday. The two men are both drivers for the Markham Sand and Gravel Co.

Gas Explodes The collision, a blast of sand and steel ended with a gasoline explosion which shook houses 400 yards away. Leask died instantly, the cab of his truck ripped in four sections, and Galbraith was burned to death as his turned-over vehicle burst into flames.

Swung Out To Pass Police said that Leask swung out of his northbound lane to pass two other trucks opposite Ernest Ave. and collided head-on with the truck driven by his friend.

Wife & Daughter Witness Mrs. Leask and daughter Marion, who had driven Mr. Leask to the pit in the morning, returned to pick him up and witnessed the accident without realizing who the victims were. Besides his wife and daughter Marion, Leask is survived by two other daughters, Kathleen and Lucille.

An eye-witness, Douglas Catto, of York Mills ,reported that the debris of the trucks was spread over a large area and the tires on the burning truck exploded like cannon blasts.

Police and motorists were unable to rescue Galbraith because of the intense heat and it was 45 minutes after the fire was extinguished before they could reach
