#### About Books And Reading

By the Thornhill Librarian

We have just returned from Stratford Shakespeare's new home this side of the Atlantic. We say Richard III, and the scope and violence of it left us breathless. Here is Richard as Shakespeare saw him. as history sees him, as Mr. Guinness portrays him, a malevolent cripple, a hypocrite, a monster of evil and intrigue. In facial apnot grotesque, and neither are the portraits of this Plantagenet which are to be found in London's Tate and National Galleries. And it is this business of faces and history that leads me to speak of a book in our Library that is immensely and curiously interesting. It is Josephine Tey's "Daughter of Time" and it too deals with Richard III but not in the familiar or accepted way. Miss Tey's hero is a Scotland Yard Detective, with a marked talent for physiogonomy, a medical student's knowledge of bone structure and facial characteristics. I among them Richard III. 




