Markham Expects To Move Into New Twp. Offices On Monday

Markham Township Council expects to move into their new township offices located in Buttonville by next Monday. The Council has completed arrangements to have the building cleaned up in preparation for the move. The old Unionville offices have been sold to a local heating contractor and the Council has until January 4 to vacate the old premises.

After careful consideration of the furniture requirements for the new offices the members authorized the Engineer and Treasurer to purchase their office equipment, and the Clerk to purchase shelving. There is still the sum of \$1,500 set aside in this year's budget for such equipment. The furniture requirements of the remainder of the staff will be considered by the 1954 Council.

High School Appointment

The members have authorized Reeve W. Timbers and Deputy-Reeve A. LeMasurier to suggest to County Council that the next County representative on the Richmond Hill District High School Board come from the southern part of the High School District. With the new Thornhill High School to be built soon there has been a strong feeling that additional representation from the southern area would be a decided advantage. The present County representative on the Board is Mr. H. Charles, a resident of Richmond Hill.

Road Budget

The whole Council will meet with the Minister of Highways this week to consider a possible restoration of the Department's earlier cut in Markham road budget.

King Trustees Settle Accounts

Payment for services rendered to the village during the year of 1953 were passed at the final regular meeting of the Commissioners of King City on Monday night. It was moved by R. McLeod and seconded by W. Carson that a standing payment of \$20 be paid to each trustee of 1953, and to the secretary, W. H. F. Wood.

Supplementary salaries of \$25 were paid to W. A. Carson for services to the village as water-works superintendent, and to R. McLeod for services as roadways superintendent. From the General levy the salary of \$50 will be paid to Ewart Patton for street light maintenance. From the water-works account, the sum of \$100 will be paid to Frank Morrison for water pump maintenance, and to W. F. H. Hood \$150 for his services as secretary of the village water-works.

The usual amounts will be paid to Bert Kelley and Mrs. I. L. Scott, who were D.R.O. and Poll Clerk on the day of the village election.

(Continued from page 1) in September. Mr. Morrow has taught in the High School since 1945.

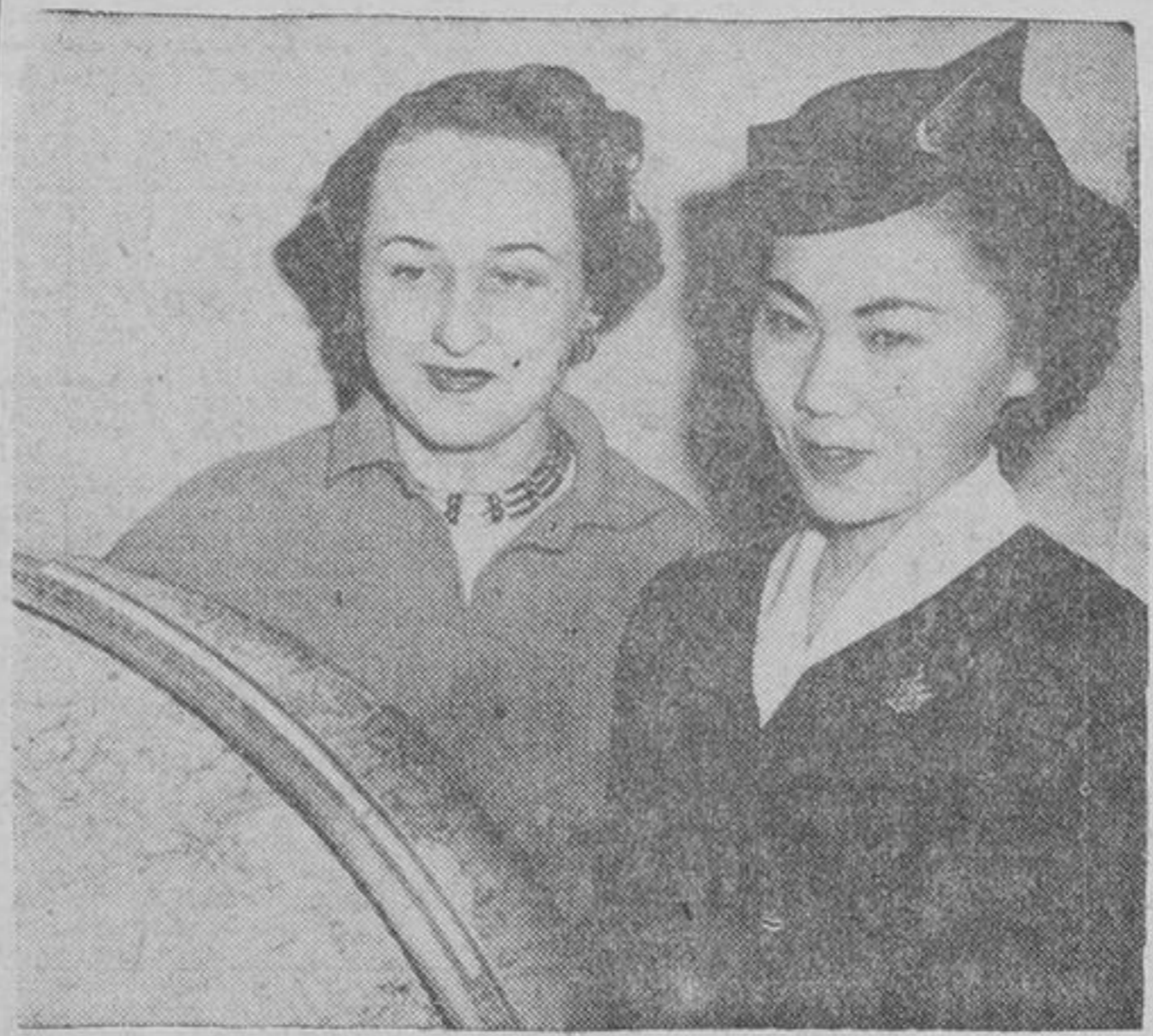
Other Business

In his report, Principal A. S. Elson gave the attendance figure at 95.57% for the month of November with registration at 551. The Board received a letter from the School Area 1 Markham and Vaughan Board advising of the resignation of Trustee Campbell Smith. The Board expressed its regret at losing Mr. Smith from the Board.

On a resolution by Trustees Dean and Charles, the Board will receive \$5 per meeting for a maximum of 12 meetings plus 7c per mile, in accordance with the High School Act.

Trustee Mrs. Hill stated that she felt that the Board members should have a copy of the agreement under which the High School District was formed. She added that a resume of important facts regarding the school staff and administration, etc., should be prepared for the benefit of the new members who will be coming onto the Board in the new year.

Mrs. Hill was requested to assist the secretary in preparing the facts. The inaugural meeting on December 21, 1954 will be held on J.

Truck Collides with School Bus

A small pick-up truck, driven by John B. Therrien, Stop 21, Langstaff, skidded into the left rear corner of Mortonson's school bus at the height of last Tuesday's bad snow-storm.

Merrill Johnson, Gormley, driver of the school bus had just discharged several of his youthful passengers at the Townline, Jefferson, when the truck, also south-bound on Yonge St. came over the hill and collided with the bus shaking up the 15 Jefferson school children who were still in the bus. No one was injured.

P. C. Gordon Nutley of the OPP Thornhill detachment said it was unavoidable. The highway had narrowed owing to the heavy fall of snow, the road was slippery due to heavy northbound traffic Therrien could not pull over into the other lane.

Damages to the bus were in the neighborhood of \$70. Police estimated damage to the right fender, headlight and bumper of the truck were about \$75. No charges were laid.
