Your Librarian believes in a Santa Claus. The notes to Santa tossed into the fireplace have been many and varied.

One of the very first to be written was a request that on Christmas morning under the Librarian's tree would be a set of The Encyclopedia Britannica. What a lovely smell of printers' ink and leather! and what pleasure and profit it would bring to inquiring minds on Library night!

And one night another note was blown from Thornhill to the North Pole, asking the extra means to buy all those foundation books which are only borrowed a few times each year but to which the discerning reader should have ready access—Bronte, Dickens, Austin, the great travellers such as Marco Polo and Nansen, the great thinkers ancient and modern, books on religion like Newman's Apologia pro Vita and Fraser's 'Golden Bough', Men of Freedom, — and all in handsome covers, clever illustrations and fine type on good paper.

**Disease Transmission**
