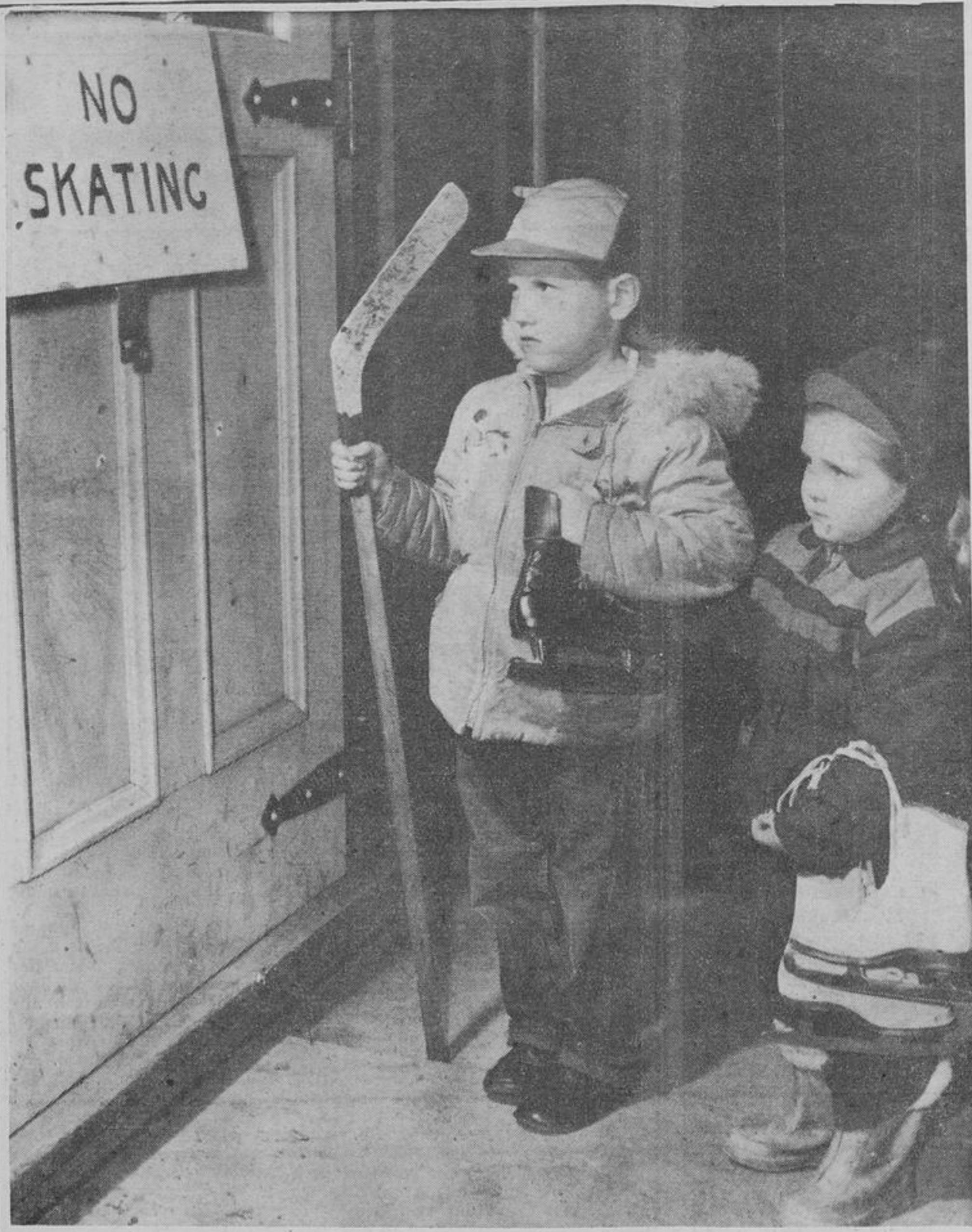

### Vaughan Feder. Of Agriculture Hear Talk On Assessment

Mr. J. N. MacDonald, clerk of Vaughan Township, in addressing a meeting of the Vaughan Township Federation of Agriculture in Edgeley Community Hall, recently discussed the new method of assessing the tax burden being considered for municipal taxation. At the present time farming the greater share of the tax burden while buildings, both farm and residential, are assuming a much smaller share of the tax burden in comparison to their value. By the new system of assessment, the land and buildings would be assessed for a similar percentage of their actual value.

Mr. MacDonald also answered numerous questions put forth regarding the re-assessment programme.

Ray Hergatt, director of Field Services, Ontario Federation of Agriculture, discussed Township program planning.

The Unionville Junior Farmers and Junior Institute quartette presented several lively numbers.

The May meeting, it is expected, will take the form of a tour, the plans of which are as yet incomplete.

Excerpts from the files of The Liberal Home paper of the Richmond Hill district since 1878

**APRIL 24, 1947**

The newly formed Thornhill Lions Club held Charter Night on April 21.

Members of the North York District Women's Institutes will hold their first achievement day in Newmarket on April 29.

Supplies of food and clothing are being collected in the village as part of Canada's aid to flood victims in Britain.

**APRIL 27, 1916**  
A boy riding a horse and leading two others was hit by a metropolitan railway car at Langstaff while en route to Toronto from the Dominion House. The boy was unhurt but two horses had to be destroyed.

**MAY 1, 1884**
