When Bostock. the corn comes up, they say the boys and girls have to stay on the farm night and day to chase away the baboons or they would eat all the corn when it first starts. There are about 6,000 people living in Igbetti. Their farms lie

outside the town and they go out each day to work there. To work their farms, of course they don't have tractors or ploughs. The Africans just use a short handled hoe to break up the ground. They plant their seeds in ridges which they make in long rows. This is so that, when

the heavy rains come, their seed doesn't get washed away. The homes of the Africans are very simple but interesting. They are made out of mud blocks which have been baked in the sun. The roofs are thatched. That means they use bundles of tall dry grass and tie them all together for their roof. The rain doesn't come through. Their houses do not have floors, or chairs, or beds.
