County Increases Per Diem Rate For Wards Of Children's Aid

The application of York County Children's Aid Society to increase the per diem rate for maintenance of the wards of the Society, first heard by York County Council in July, was discussed at council's meeting last week. Solicitor J. D. Lucas was present at the hearing and advised that it was in the interest of the county to have the rate increased within the limit of the grant for the purpose of subsidy and that the increase should be retroactive to January 1, 1954.

The subsidy, given in lieu of the grant, is 25 per cent for cost of wards on the rate set by the judge. The rate set by Judge Webster is \$2.05 per diem.

All municipalities in the county, having agreed to the increase, the request of Miss E. King of Sutton Hospital and the Briar-bush Hospital at Stouffville, for an increase in per diem rate to \$3.00, was granted.

Former County Associates

The report of the Warden and Commissioners, made mention of the passing, since last session of council, of J. Stanley Osbourne of East Gwillimbury, former Warden, and of the former York County Engineer, Harvey C. Rose. At the time of their deaths, sincere sympathy was extended to both families.

Application to the Municipal Board regarding the distribution of assets and liabilities of the County of York was made, but up to the present time no decision has been announced by that body.

The Municipality of Metropolitan Toronto has agreed to pay to the County of York the average cost of maintenance for each of their residents who are living at York Manor.

Guarantee Payment
The Children's Observation Home, operated by Metropolitan Toronto have refused to accept retarded children from the Children's Aid Society who are wards of the County of York, unless a guarantee of payment is forthcoming. The warden and commissioners passed a resolution covering payment. Eight wards of York County are resident in that home and the cost is \$12.00 per day for each child. The warden's and commission-ers' report on the registry office caused a lengthy discussion. Some councillors thought that the Metro Council should release all of the county land transactions to the registry office at Newmarket. The addition being planned will accommodate the

whole county and "we need that grave" said Reeve J. Dales of Newmarket. At a meeting held in the office of the Hon. Dana Porter Q.C., on September 20, the county was represented by the Warden, Solicitor and clerk. A number of proposals were put forward and the consensus of opinion was that the best plan to overcome the present difficulties would be to make registry offices a Metropolitan function. Solicitor Lucas reported that six different methods of legislation covering the proposals are being considered.

Undue Burden

After extensive research by solicitor Lucas, C. McTague, and McDonald Currie and Co., auditors, an application for relief from undue burden caused by the passing of Bill 80 has been made to the Municipal Board.

May Extend Boundaries

The warden and commissioners recommended that the following by-laws be brought in at this session:
To extend the boundaries of King City, to enlarge the registry office at Newmarket, by-law to confirm by-laws No. 1886 and 1867 of Vaughan Township and by-law No. 1001 of township of King.

Pre-Election Meeting

A pre-election public meeting sponsored by the joint Ratepayers' Associations of Ward 1, Markham Township, will be held at Henderson Avenue School on Tuesday, November 16, at 8 P.M.

The purpose of the meeting is to enable the rate-payers to meet the candidates for the offices of Reeve, Deputy-Reeve, Councillor Ward 1, and School Trustee. Candidates and ratepayers are asked to be on hand in good time for the meeting. For further information telephone AV. 5-1497.

Discover Cache Historical Records

By a twist of fate the Unionville Veterans organization have stumbled upon a valuable cache of historical documents relating to the early growth of the Markham township.

While in the act of repairing two windows in the Unionville Veterans Hall broken during Halloween the workmen stumbled on a secret cupboard high on the wall of the building. When opened a large array of old township documents was discovered. These include the early minute book of the Markham and Elgin Mills Plank Road Company dating back to 1847, as well as various other municipal records.

Some of the books have already been removed to the township vault at Buttonville for safe keeping, and it is expected the remainder will be turned over to the township at a later date.

The building in which they were found was at one time the property of the municipality. So far no one has been able to ascertain who might have placed the documents in their secret hiding place.
