Local Iris Grower Radio Guest Of John Bradshaw

For the first time in its history, the American Iris Society is holding its Annual Convention outside the United States. Headquarters for the event this year is the Royal Connaught Hotel, Hamilton, The Canadian Iris Society which is Region 16 of the International group, is host to the parent Society.

An exceptionally early season has compelled the local committee to advance the Convention date by one week to June 5, 6 and 7, after having established the original dates three years ago. Having this Convention at the height of the Iris season is of the utmost importance since a major portion of the program is garden visiting.

For the past three years, Iris hybridists from Canada, the United States and Britain have been sending their newest seedlings so that they would be on view at convention time in the gardens on the itinerary. Facilities at the Royal Botanical Gardens, Hamilton, have been used to acquire and distribute some 400 'Guest Irises' to eight gardens in the Hamilton-Niagara-Toronto area. A considerable feat with import permits, inspection and custom regulations.

A highlight of the Convention will be the opportunity of delegates to hear the distinguished Irishman, Harry Randall, President of the British Iris Society, who is flying over to deliver the main address at the final banquet, Tuesday evening. In addition, Mr. Randall will have the pleasure of presenting the Dykes Medal to Orville Fay, Wilmette, Illinois, whose lovely iris 'Mary Randall' was thus coveted award in 1954 - a variety named after Mr. Randall's daughter.

Another personality in the Horticultural world known and loved across the continent as 'The Old Dirt Dauber' - Sam Caldwell, will be Chairman for the event. The public is invited to take the opportunity of seeing some of these lovely creations as well as the best in standard iris varieties in the public gardens where 'Guest Irises' have been placed - including the garden at the Horticultural Experiment Station, Vineland, Glendon Hall on Bayview Avenue, Toronto and the Spring Garden, Royal Botanical Gardens, Hamilton.

R. D. Little, a Richmond Hill iris grower and hybridizer, will be a guest on John Bradshaw's CFRB Radio Program at 9:10 a.m. on Saturday, June 4, when the Iris Convention will be discussed.
