**Asia's First Penicillin Factory**



Asia's first penicillin factory, at Pimpri near Poona, India, is now well on the way to reaching its present production target of 1,000 pounds a month. Production began last March. Plant was set up with aid of the United Nations Technical Assistance Administration, World Health Organization, and U.N. Children's Fund. Also with their aid, 13 Indians so far have been trained abroad in penicillin production. 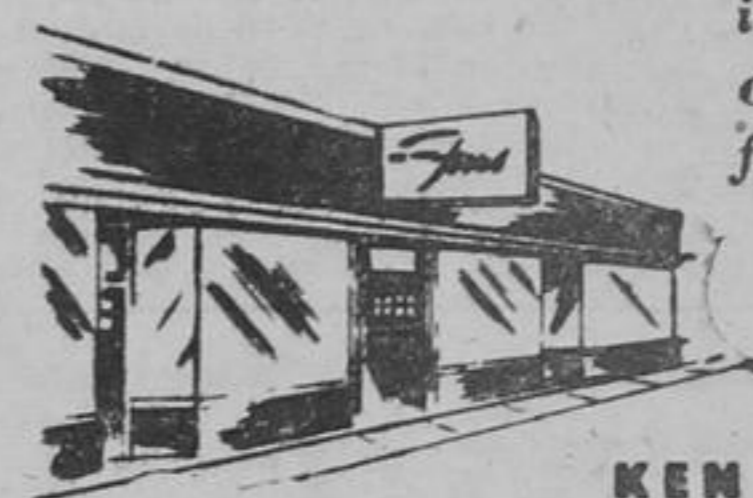
