Cream Producers Annual Meeting

Over 200 cream producer delegates gathered at the Royal York Hotel, Toronto on November 15, for the 8th annual meeting of the Ontario Cream Producers Association. The president, E. H. Martin, Richards Landing gave a very informative address in which he pointed out that 43% of the milk produced in Ontario was used to make butter. He also said that it was very important to maintain a fixed price and that a vigorous advertising and marketing plan should be carried on.

Mr. Orville Shugg, Director of publicity for the dairy farmers of Canada, gave a report on a program of advertising dairy products, especially butter. The Ontario Cream Producers' fieldman, Paul Courian gave a summary of the work carried out by his department; that of check listing at creameries and visits to producers who were having trouble with quality. The guest speaker at the noon luncheon was Hon. C. B. Sherwood, Minister of Agriculture for New Brunswick.

A. J. Wood of Alliston was again elected director from District 3 comprising the counties of Ontario, York, Halton, Peel and Simcoe.

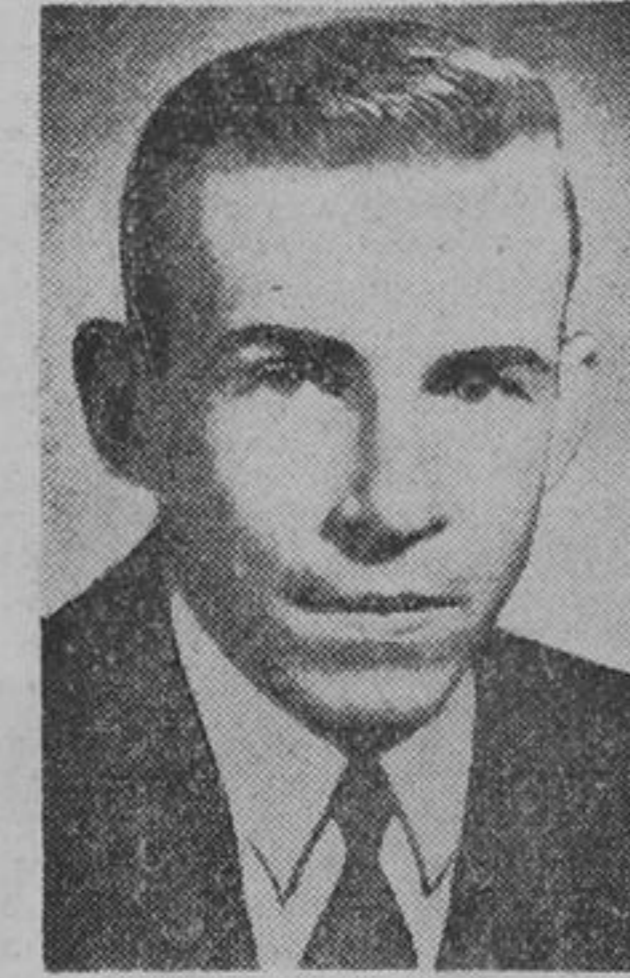

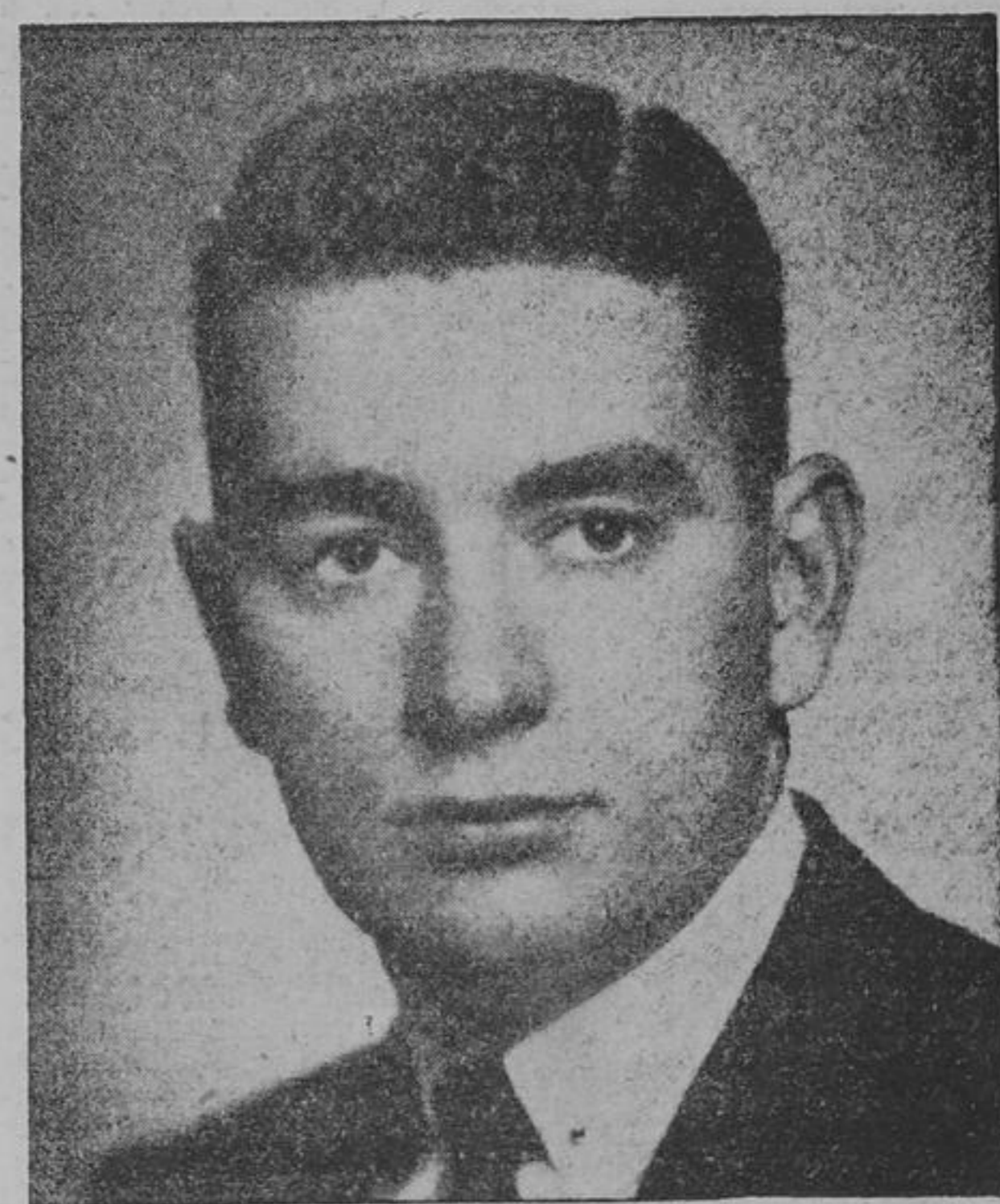
