Edgeley Forum cited two important advantages of Ontario medical co-operatives and favored a plan controlled by the people it serves. The Ontario medical co-operatives also have a Catastrophic Plan which is widely accepted by the members and pays 60 per cent of major expenses when families lose their life savings and get helplessly into debt because their medical expenses run into four figures.


