In Operation By Late 1957

Build Addition To Local Bell Exchange

An important step forward in the Bell Telephone Company's program to keep pace with the rapid growth of Richmond Hill was taken this week when it was announced that a contract has been awarded for the construction of an addition to the dial telephone exchange building on Richmond street, Richmond Hill.

C. E. Blosdale, Bell Telephone manager for this region, said the contract for construction of the addition has been awarded to Mollenhauer Contracting Company Ltd., of Toronto.

Installation of additional dial equipment, sufficient to serve some 1,600 more customers, will get under way next summer when construction of the addition has been completed. The new equipment will be placed in operation late in 1957.

The new addition will be one-storey with basement, about 34 feet wide by 42 feet deep, of reinforced concrete and brick and block construction. Work on the extension is scheduled to get under way next month.

Increased Service
"About 450 residents of Richmond Hill recently received telephone service as a result of installation of new equipment in the exchange building," Mr. Blosdale explained. "More persons will receive service as the job of extending the outside wire-and-cable network into new residential areas progresses in coming months."

Richmond Hill's facilities will be further relieved when 400 telephone users now served by the Richmond Hill exchange receive Oak Ridges service next month. This will release Richmond Hill equipment to serve more customers here.

A new telephone exchange to serve the Oak Ridges area will be opened on December 2. At that time, all Oak Ridges telephones will be brought within direct dialing range of Richmond Hill. Two-way calling between Richmond Hill and King will remain free from long distance charges.
