
#### Fires Reported To Police

Concerned with the high cost of fighting grass fires Markham Township Council Monday issued instructions that all future fire calls are to be referred to police department for investigation. The discussion was brought on by the tabling of a bill from the Richmond Hill Fire Brigade for \$1,050.00, covering 21 fire calls over a five day period.

"I've never seen anything like it," remarked Clerk H. Crisp in presenting the ac-"All these fires be investigated," stated Reeve W. L. Clark, "I think there is a good deal of carelessness in starting these fires," he added.

Council plans to send out a printed card to all taxpayers informing them that the police should be notified of all fires.

The tremendous increase in fire calls during this spring is shown in the number of calls answered by the Unionville Brigade, Last year Unionville had only 21 calls during the whole year. In the month of March of this year alone they have answered 28 grass fires.


