\$12.00 to \$50.00 is the amount of the fine levied on those owners who fail to obtain a license for their dogs in Richmond Hill. Police Chief R. P. Robbins states that May 1 is positively the deadline for 1958 dog registration, and summonses will immediately be served on those owners who neglect to register. One hundred and thirty-one owners were prosecuted for failure to obtain a licence. Due to official complaints still being received, all dogs running loose will be picked up by the dog-catcher. Ravages by dogs running at large are still being reported to the police.
