The profession of nursing is open to young men as well as young ating room, in psychiatric hospitals, as supervisors of orderlies and other positions of responsi-bility. The armed forces, first-aid service in industry, and private nursing of special cases offer further opportunities for men.

The educational requirements for entrance to an approved school of nursing are the same as for young women. Not all schools accept men, but there are a number across Canada that do.

The minimum requirement for ondary School Graduation Diploma with science (physics and chemistry, or agriculture) or an equivalent certificate as determined, by the Department of Education. Some schools require Grade XIII if possible.
