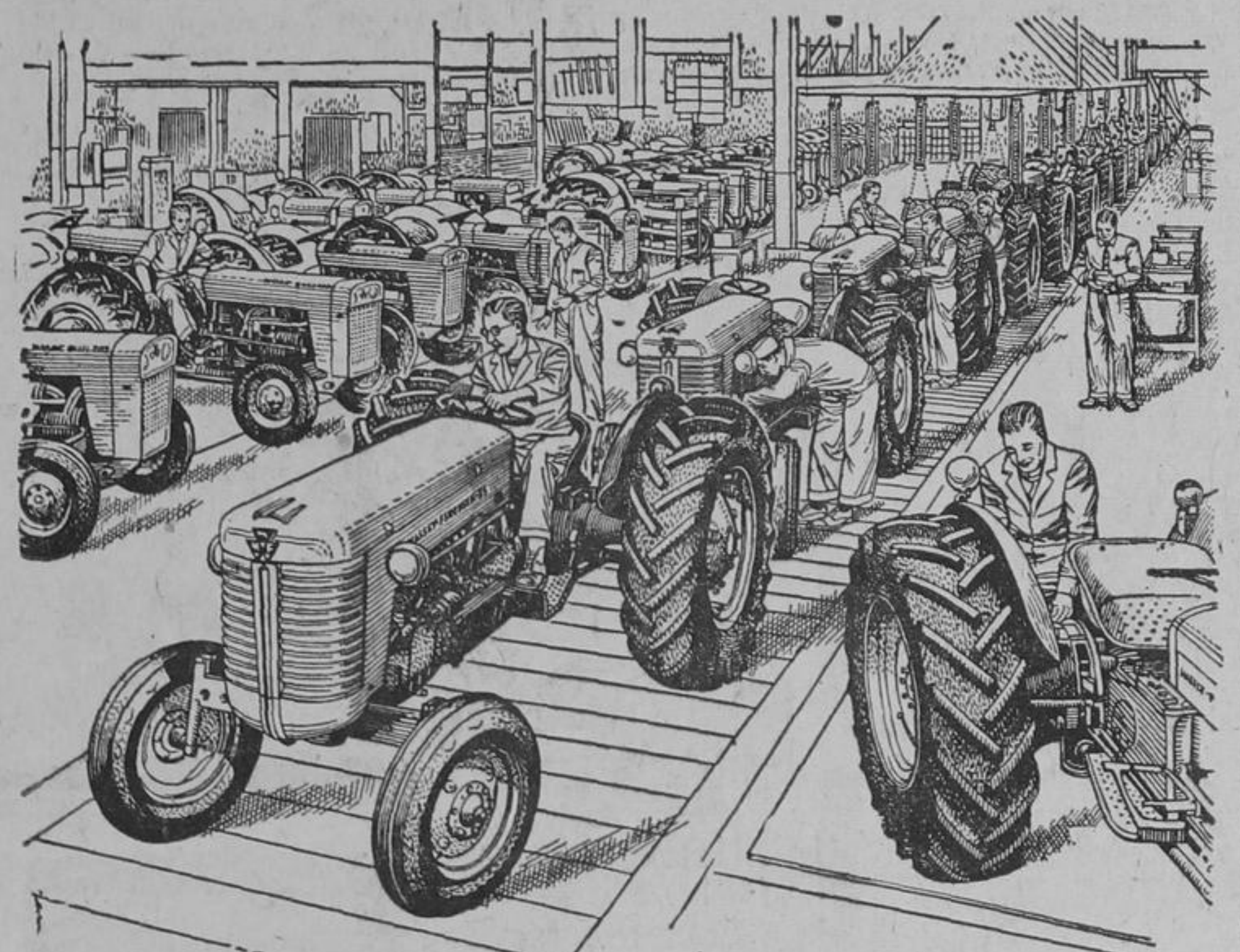

STOFFVILLE: Finance Committee Chairman Councillor K. Wagg, in a six month financial report to council stated the town is keeping well within its 1958 estimates, with some exceptions. The main deficit is expected in the matter of relief and hospitalization. Substantial savings are expected in the operation of the fire department, licenses, subsidies and permits.
