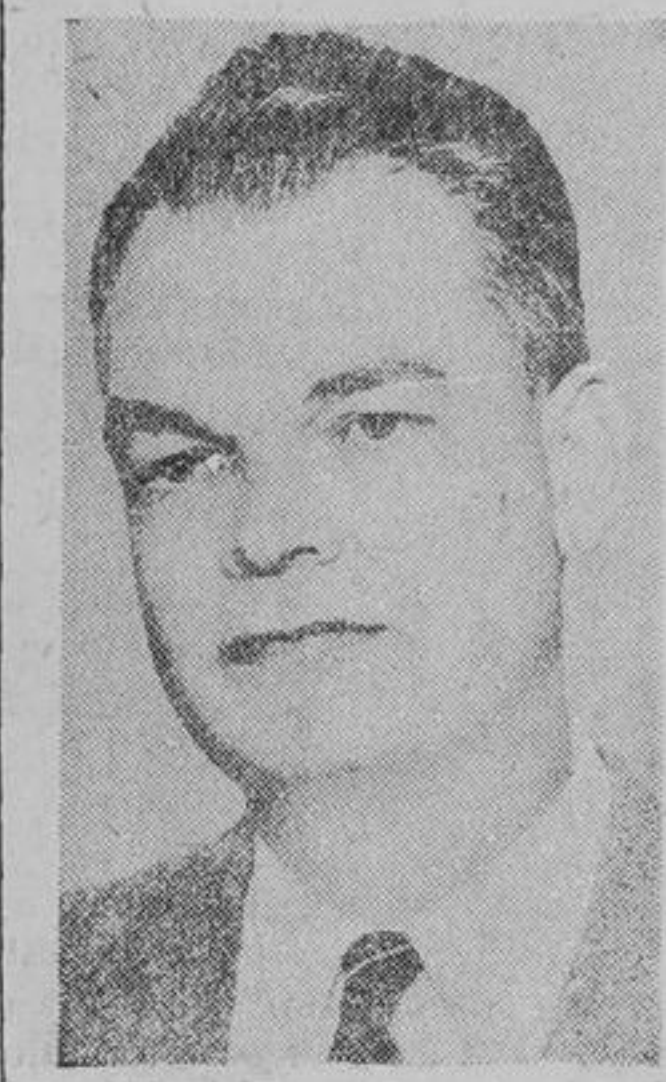

Local Doctor On Salk Committee

A report of the Ontario Department of Health just released states that with only one exception in the 1,800,000 Ontario children fully vaccinated (with three shots) "The Salk vaccine really works!"

Of interest to local residents is the fact that Dr. G. K. Martin of Richmond Hill, Director of the Division of Maternal and Child Hygiene for the Ontario Department of Health, was co-author with four other leading Ontario doctors in compiling this amazingly gratifying report. Dr. W. G. Brown, Ontario's Deputy Minister of Health headed the five man committee in its research into the vaccine program which began three years ago.

A graduate of the University of Toronto 1948, Dr. Martin received his diploma in public health at the university in 1950 following a post graduate course. He became the medical officer at Bracebridge for the Muskoka Dis-

strict Health Unit that same year, then moved to Richmond Hill in 1954 when he became a director of the Ontario Department of Health.

Dr. Martin married Miss Dorothy Reed of Toronto in 1949 and they have three children, David 8, Bruce 6 and Anne 5. A member of the town library board, Dr. Martin and his family attend Richmond Hill United Church.

Now that the report is completed Dr. Martin and his colleagues Dr. Brown feel most strongly that adults — as well as children — should receive the Salk vaccine too.

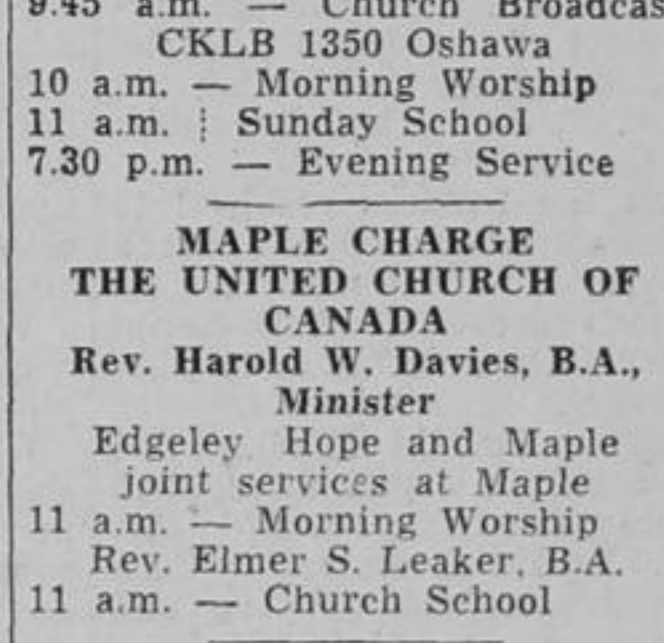
