
#### ONE OF THE WORLD'S LARGEST THERMAL-ELECTRIC STATIONS BEING BUILT BY HYDRO



If the Lakeview Generating Station, one of the world's largest thermalelectric plants now being built by Ontario Hydro, were erected on Toronto's University Avenue, it would blanket almost an entire block, as shown above. Actually, this station is to be located on a site at the former Long Branch Rifle Ranges in Toronto Township. The upper left reproduction is a model of the station. Representing a capital investment of some \$250 million, this plant is scheduled to be completed in the "mid-sixties." It is expected to have an ultimate capacity

of 1,800,000 kilowatts, more than double that of Ontario Hydro's St. Lawrence Power Project. The Generating Station will be 936 feet in length, 293 feet in width, and 192 feet high with each of the three stacks towering to a height of 450 feet.

The artist's impression of the plant superimposed on this familiar area of University Avenue, pinpoints such well-known structures as the Commission's Head Office building, the Mount Sinai Hospital and the Hospital for Sick Children.


