DEPT. OF HEALTH TWP. OF NORTH YORK Smallpox by Aeroplane

Sharp outbreaks of smallpox have occurred in different countries in the last two or three decades and have usually been due to contact with a case which has arrived by aeroplane from a country where smallpox vaccination has been neglected. The last serious epidemic in Ontario was in Windsor in 1924 where there were 67 cases, 32 of whom died.

So it can happen here. No one need have smallpox, much less die of it. It is completely controlled by vaccination and periodic revaccination. It could happen here.


