Organized Mayhem At Thornhill Spills Over Ring Into Aisles

Wrestling at the Thornhill Farmer's Market is getting to be a pretty hazardous spectator sport. Some of the opponents seen there last Tuesday night preferred to carry their bouts outside of the ring.

In the first match a one fall, 30 minute time limit bout, Hangman Howie of Fort William at 225 lbs. met a newcomer, Sammy Gabarella of New York at 195 lbs. At the 17 minute mark, referee Grant Wylder awarded the bout to Howie after he beat Gabarella into submission with two body slams and a neck breaker. However, Howie wouldn't break the hold, so he and the referee began to fight. When Wylder had forced Howie into a corner, Gabarella came after the referee and they began to tangle. When the smoke cleared, the decision was upheld.

The second match of the evening saw Jack Dennis of Timmins at 205 lbs. come to grips with Steve Bollas of Hamilton at 227 lbs. This was a two out of three fall, 45 minute time limit bout. Bollas got the first fall in 11 minutes with an effective series of a hip toss, a body slam, a back breaker and a body press. In the

second fall, Dennis came out fighting. Scared by his attack, Bollas left the ring, so Dennis went out after him and chased him back inside. Once on the mat again, Dennis then proceeded to throw Bollas out of the ring onto the press table. Bollas got into the ring again, and was met with a series of drop kicks and a body press which gave the fall to Dennis in six minutes. The third fall and the bout went to Bollas on a disqualification after Bollas had twice tied his arms in the ropes and treated him to assorted knees and arms to the stomach and chest. As soon as the decision was made, Bollas headed for the dressing room on a dead run, with Dennis hot on his heels. The room was barred to the public but judgment from the noises that went on inside, somebody was getting worked over.

The third bout was a tag team effort, with the two Frenchmen from Quebec City, Freddie LaBelle at 171 lbs., and Paul LaChance at 174 lbs. meeting Carl Mueller of Kitchener at 168 lbs. and his partner, Donny Magnatich was scheduled to be Mueller's partner, but at the last minute, Al Peko of Edmonton at 173 lbs. was brought in as an unwilling substitute. This was the first time Peko had fought since he broke his arm in one match and dislocated it in the next. It was a one fall, 30 minute time limit match. Of the bad guys, Peko went in first, and fought fairly. His partner didn't approve, and when he went in, he used his favorite split knee drop with spine

crushing effectiveness on LaBelle. Then the tide turned, and after several minutes, Peko came to Peko for a tag, but Peko would have none of him. At the 18 minute mark, LaBelle threw Mueller out of the ring, and he landed on the press table. With that, Mueller stomped off to the dressing room in disgust, so referee Grant Wylder awarded the fall and the bout to LaBelle and LaChance by disqualification. Thereupon, Mueller re-entered the ring to issue an open challenge to any other team, but his remarks were drowned out by the boos of the audience.

The feature event of the evening was a two out of three fall, 60 minute time limit match between Joe Szabo of Hungary at 227 lbs. and Red Garner of Langstaff at 195 lbs. It appeared the bout would be over quickly when Szabo took the first fall in 8 minutes with a sleeper hold on Garner after repeated choking and a neck-breaker. Then in the second fall, with Garner still groggy, Szabo ran him headfirst into the steel corner post outside the ring, and into the turnbuckle inside the ring. However, Garner's stamina helped him, and he came back to take the fall in 12 minutes with two body slams from the ropes, a head butt, an arm drag and a body press. As both men entered the third fall, they seemed a little drained of strength. At the nine minute mark, Szabo had a rear body scissors on Garner, but Garner backed up and forced the Hungarian on his back for the three count to take the fall and the match.

"Pure" Wrestling To Be Featured At Thornhill Market

At Thornhill Market this coming Tuesday, November 3, wrestling fans will get a chance to see two of Canada's lightweight wrestling champions in action. The two in question are Aledo Orlando and Red Garner, Langstaff veteran. Both of these men are familiar to local wrestling fans, and both have been in open competition for many years. Orlando has been an amateur title holder as well as Canadian Middleweight champion (pro) and Garner although well past the middleweight class by now has also been a Canadian champion and for two years held the Quebec recognition as World's Welterweight champion. There is no animosity between these two stellar mat men because of this bout and the fans will see some real wrestling, with more holds and counter holds than they have seen for many a season. Orlando feels that he can take Red as he figures on being able to move faster and also to have the advantage of being much the younger man. On the other hand Garner has been campaigning regularly across the line as well as locally, and with his greater experience and weight advantage he feels that he can pin the popular Italian wrestler. Both men are very popular locally with, I think, most of the fans pulling for Orlando. At any rate when these two lock horns at the Thornhill Market, Tuesday, November 3, the fans will see some real wrestling. Three other bouts will round out this card and we notice that Eddie Garner Jr. will make his debut against Grant Wylder, rugged little welterweight.

Jim Rushlow scored two TDs and kicked one convert, while Jim Weir skidded over the line for the third TD. The convert was successfully run by fullback Gary Kozak. Winning this game means that the Richmond Hill High School Juniors under the able coaching of Mr. Snider, have captured the North York Jr. Championship, winning all of their league games and losing an exhibition game to the Markham Seniors.

Richmond Hill placed 3rd out of 17 entries in the Ontario Cross-country championships.

Of the 106 who finished the race, Ron Brice came third, Harold Mann fifth, Metro Kwak 12th and Paul Brent 19th. 106 is the largest entry so far for this event.

In the Georgian Bay senior cross-country meet held on October 18, RHHS took 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 7th places to win the meet, with Brice, Kozak and Mann placing in that order for Richmond Hill.

It is expected that the Ontario cross-country championships will be run at Richmond Hill next year.

Sweater Colours Set For 8 Teams In Minor Hockey

Last Wednesday night, October 22, a special meeting was held at the Richmond Hill arena for all those interested in the Richmond Hill Minor Hockey League.

President Dick Pillar informed the meeting that there had been some misunderstanding regarding registration of the players. He explained that all the boys do is register at Al White's sports store on Yonge St. Then the coaches and managers get the applications and go on from there to form their teams.

In the matter of equipment, the league already has on hand 15 sweaters and 15 pairs of socks for each team. They are now purchasing sets of goalie pads.

This year there will be eight teams at least, depending on registration.

The executive of the association has chosen the team colors. The bantams will have green sweaters with white stripes; Birrells Motors will have black bodies with yellow trim; the Canadian Legion team will get last year's sweaters, since their colors don't change; Bayview Plaza will have brown with gold trim; R. D. Little Motors will use dark maroon with white trim; Wimbidge Cleaners will have dark blue with gold; ABC has been tentatively set at green and white similar to the bantams and a new sponsor, Village Taxi, has been allotted white bodies with red trim.

It has been decided that all the sweaters will remain the property of the league from now on because of the increased expense.

Six of the teams will make up the house league with boys from 12 to 16. The bantams from 12 to 14, and the midgets from 15 to 16 will represent Richmond Hill at other games in outside areas.
