Ground-breaking ceremonies in connection with construction of a \$70,000 dam at the Albion Hills conservation area near Bolton were held by officials of the Metropolitan Toronto & Region Conservation Authority recently. The dam will be 18 feet high with a two-lane traffic road running across it and the reservoir created by it will cover 12½ acres with a maximum depth of 12 feet. Two beach areas will be prepared close to it for recreation and swimming. Work will be started on the dam immediately as part of the authority's approved winter works program. It is expected to be completed by April 30. Shown here is A. H.
