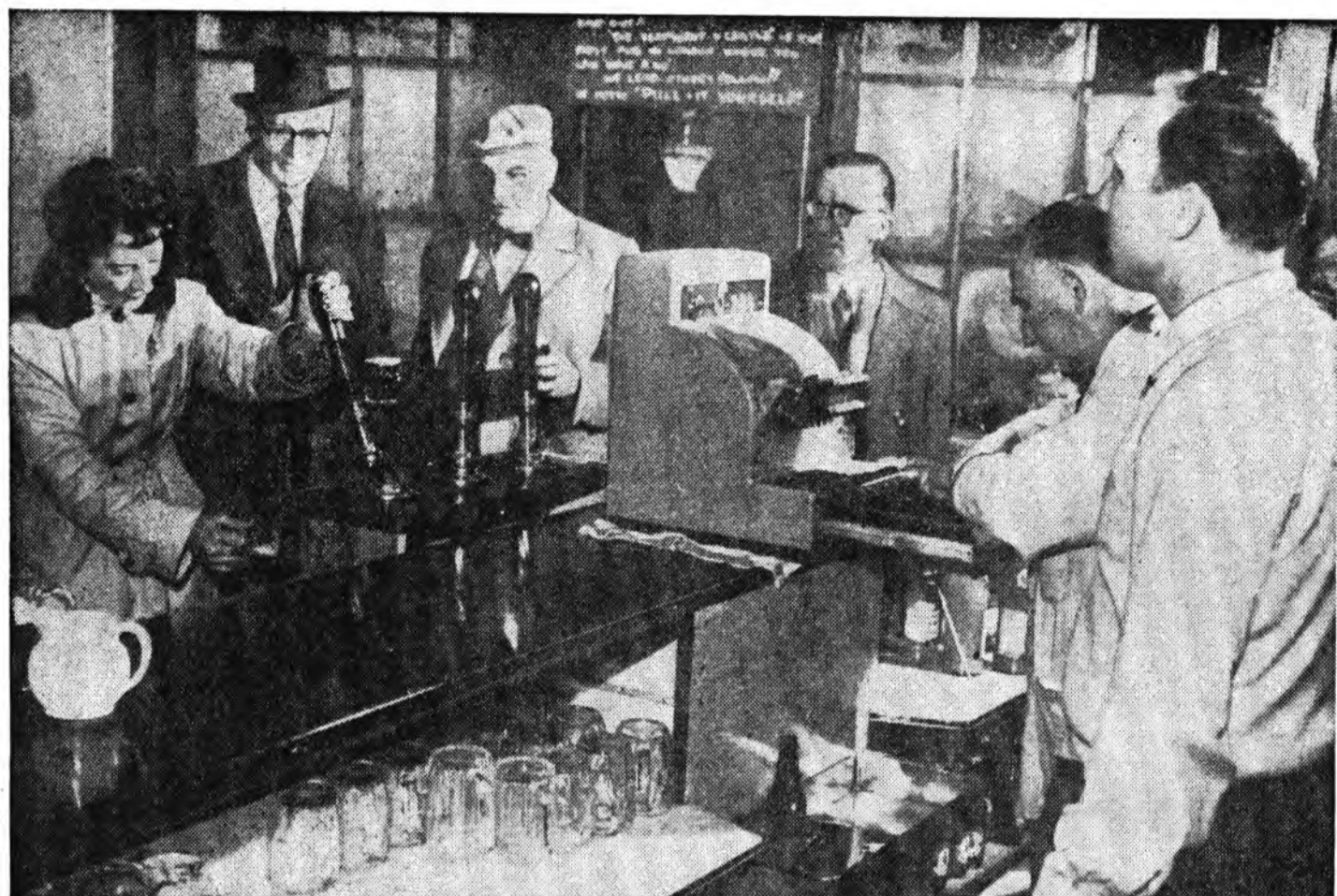
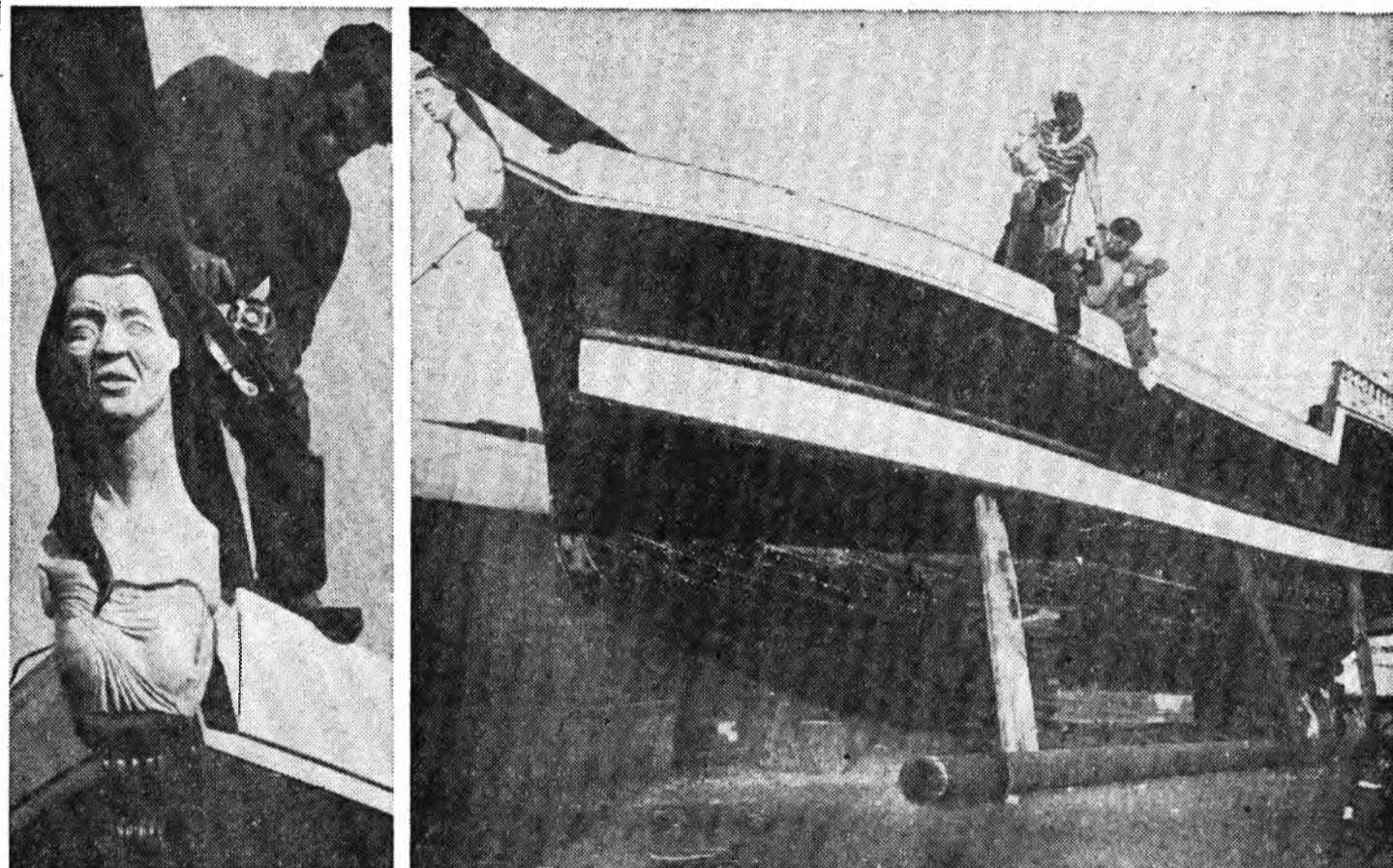

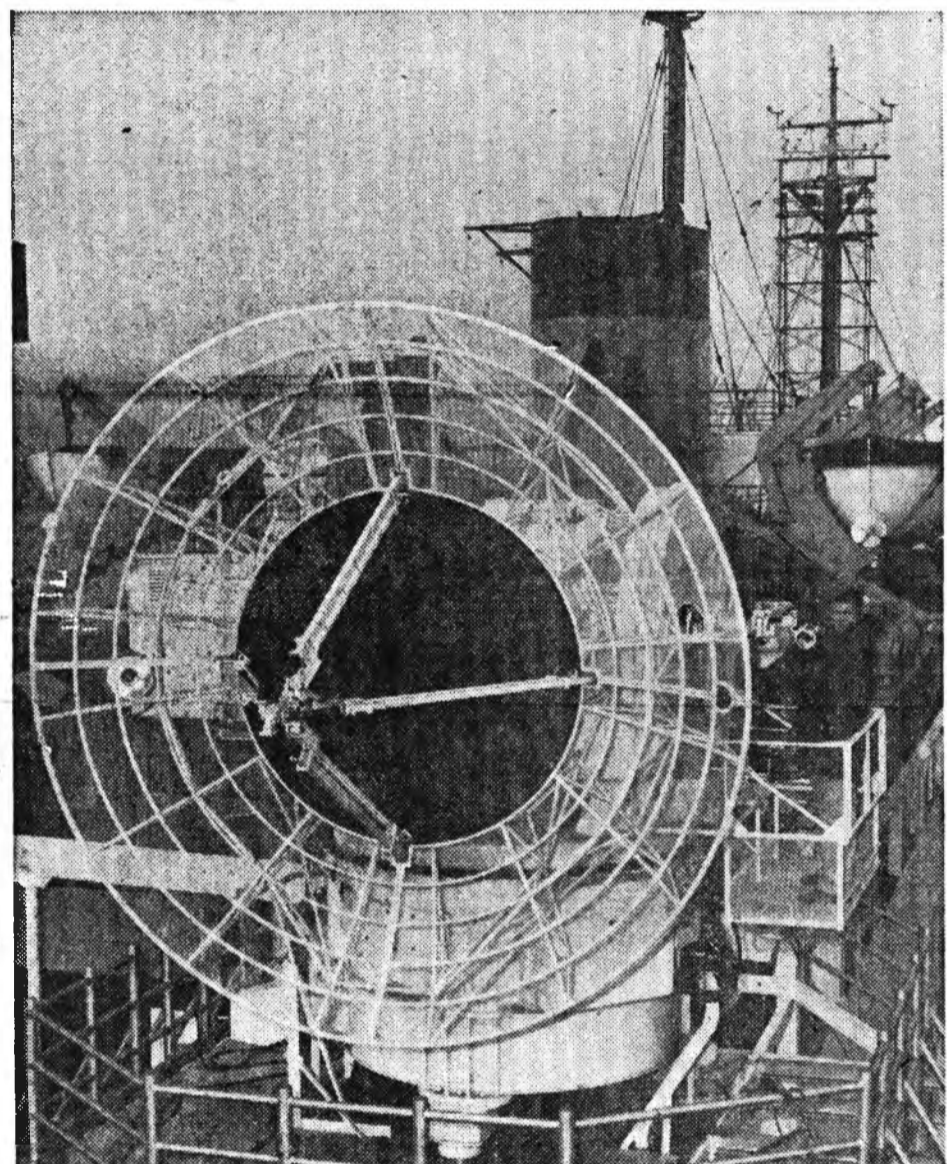

Yuen sands bow of ship.

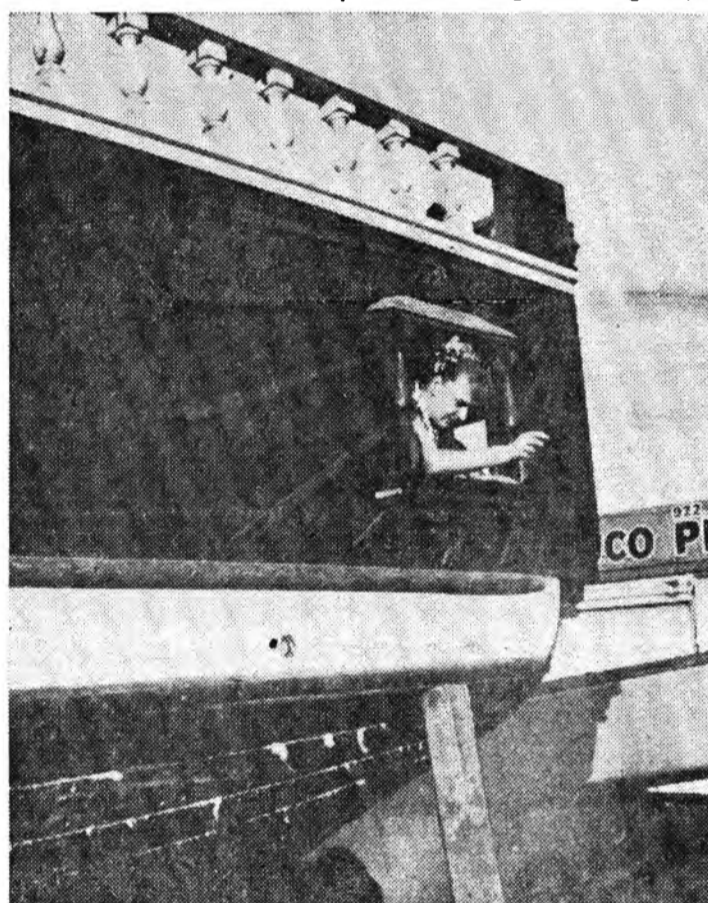
Holding her daughter; Mrs. Yuen serves coffee to husband and Stan Crockett.

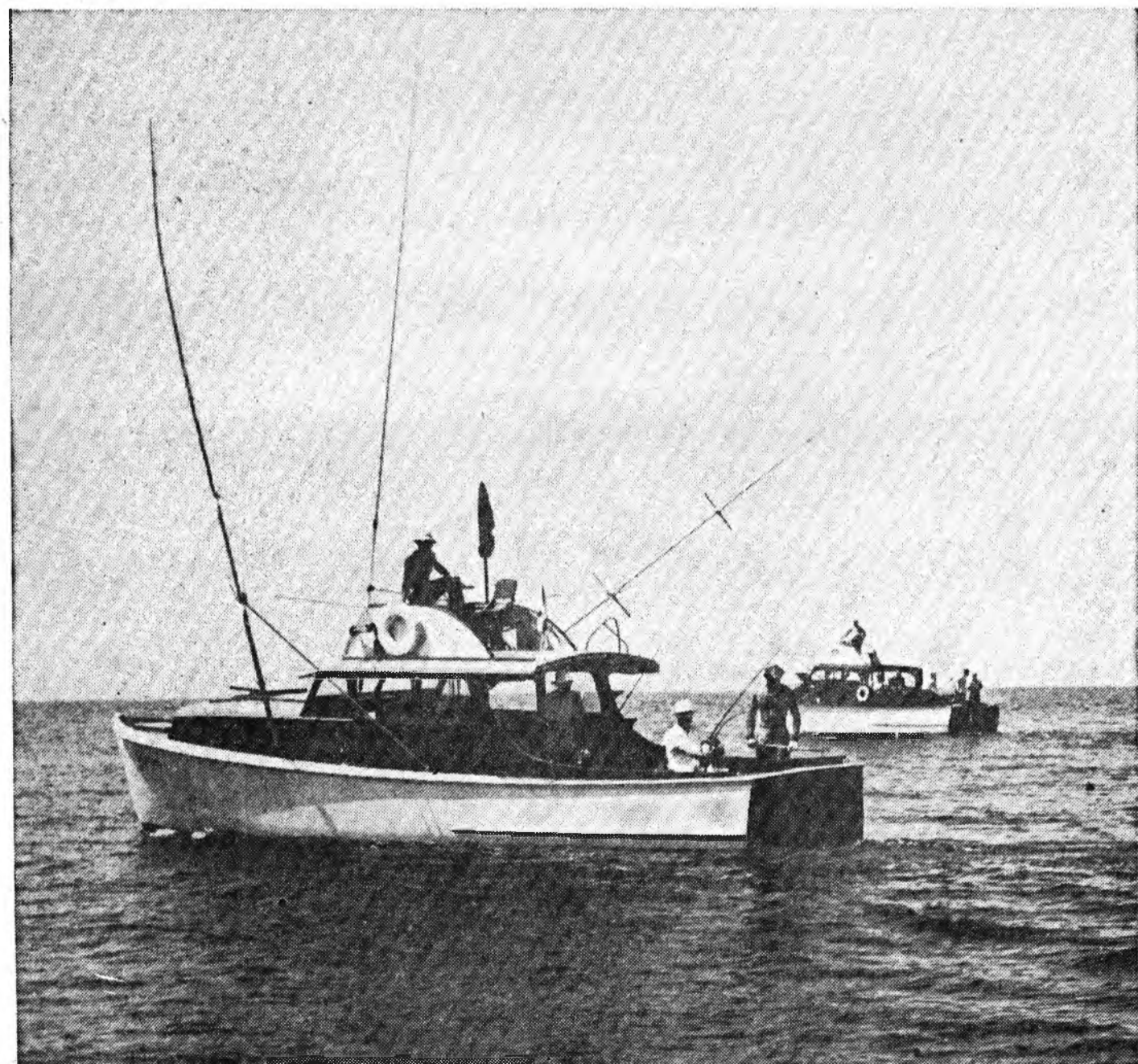

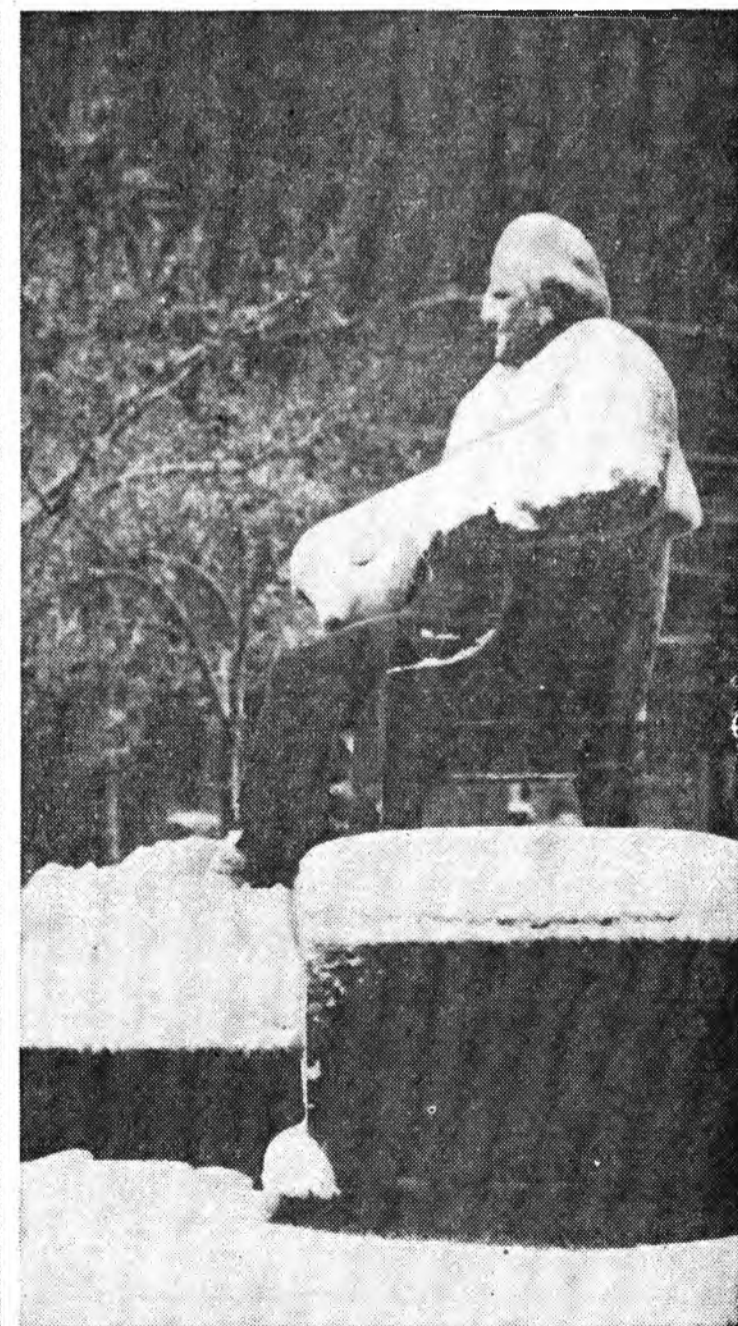
