Report Rapid Progress In County Brucellosis Testing

Since the start of the Brucellosis Control Area program in York County in early December of 1958, progress has been rapid. Veterinarians working under the direction of the Health of Animals Branch of the Canada Department of Agriculture, have tested enough herds to account for about one-quarter of the cattle population in the county.

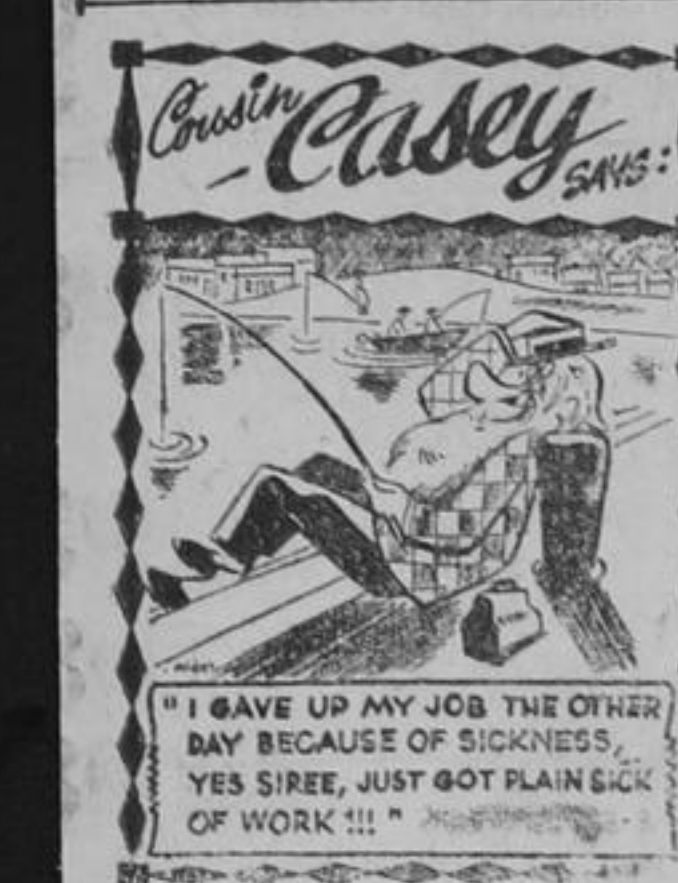
