W.H.O. Dedicated To Bettering World Health Everywhere

The World Health Organization is one of the largest of the specialized agencies of the United Nations, and is dedicated by its constitution to work for the highest possible level of health for all peoples everywhere, said Miss Kay Clark, when she addressed York Branch United Nations Association at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Wells in Maple on Monday, March 9th.

Rev. J. F. H. Morris of Aurora United Church opened the meeting with a prayer and the visitors to Maple were welcomed by Village Trustee Andrew Spider. Dr. J. T. Phair, Senior Consultant, Department of Health and former Deputy Minister of Health in the Province of Ontario, introduced Miss Clark, R.N., of King City.

Miss Clark presented an overall picture of how the earlier health programs were gradually welded together into an international health service by the United Nations and that the World Health Organization is the culmination of a century of efforts toward health co-operation. She pointed out that formerly sickness was considered a purely personal misfortune and governments had little concern for health matters. When epidemics were prevalent, countries imposed quarantine laws. The measures were often cruel, caused hardships and shipping delays to ports. In 1851 these ineffective regulations gave birth to a series of international conferences to set up a world wide health organization, but it was not until the turn of the present century that a universal method of protection against epidemics was agreed upon. The International Health Organization was formed in Paris, France, in 1909.

Following the first world war, the health organization of the League of Nations was established. It started the international standards for vaccine sera and certain important drugs and undertook studies of nutrition and housing, as well as diseases and health problems of international importance. After the second world war, the work done by both of these organizations was taken over by the World Health Organization.

Miss Clark reminded the audience that April 7th is when World Health Day is internationally celebrated. She reviewed achievements of Unicef and Unesco in the program of world health from 1948 to 1959. "A healthy nation is a wealthy nation, and 88 countries including the United States and Russia enjoy membership in this great organization," said Miss Clark.

Mrs. Donald Finley thanked the speaker and Mrs. Henderson thanked the hostess for refreshments. Mrs. A. W. McLennen presided.
