*Did Lucky Charm Really Save Gunner's Life?*

Help arrived from the centre, and Bud and the young flyer he had been trying to save were rushed off to hospital. A few days later, a little girl came to see him in hospital and brought him three pounds, eight shillings, which had been collected for the 'hero' in recognition of his bravery. "He was very touched but could only say, 'I'm only happy any of us came out of it alive.'"

Ten days later Bud was back on duty, where he eventually became Squadron Adjutant, then Flight Lieutenant. He is still attached to the RCAF reserves and once a year goes down to Toronto to recruit men for the airforce.

Bud Cable was born in Barrie, Ontario where he attended school. He has the typical Canadian inquisitiveness and searching interest, since he has spent two years at the Toronto Chiropractic College with Dr. Arthur G. Broad and Dr. H. D. Melness; attended a business college and worked for the TTC. After coming out of the airforce, Bud married Kay Wark, a Richvale girl and tried his luck at selling real estate. Finally he went into the assessment field, working in the assessment department of Markham Twp. until taking on the position of assessor for Richmond Hill in 1958.

"Bud Cable says, 'Assessment is really the best job of them all. I enjoy meeting people and doing assessment work. The public is 99 and three-quarters per cent grateful to deal with, providing they understand the assessment picture' — and explaining the assessment is just what Bud Cable enjoys doing most."

What happened to the lucky stone? We asked. Bud told us it was returned with thanks — but the identification bracelet he wore around his wrist was turned from silver to black, "probably from the high tension wire we touched," Bud thinks.

This meeting is planned as a direct follow-up of the public meeting sponsored by the McCaughey Home and School Association in January when representative heads of the York County Family Court, the York County Family Court, the local V.O.N. and the York County president of the Mental Health Association formed a panel outlining in "case history" style, the areas covered by their organizations.

Mrs. Fred Jackson formerly social service consultant to the Civil Service Health Division in Ottawa was commentator for that panel and will be acting as chairman of the March 31 meeting.

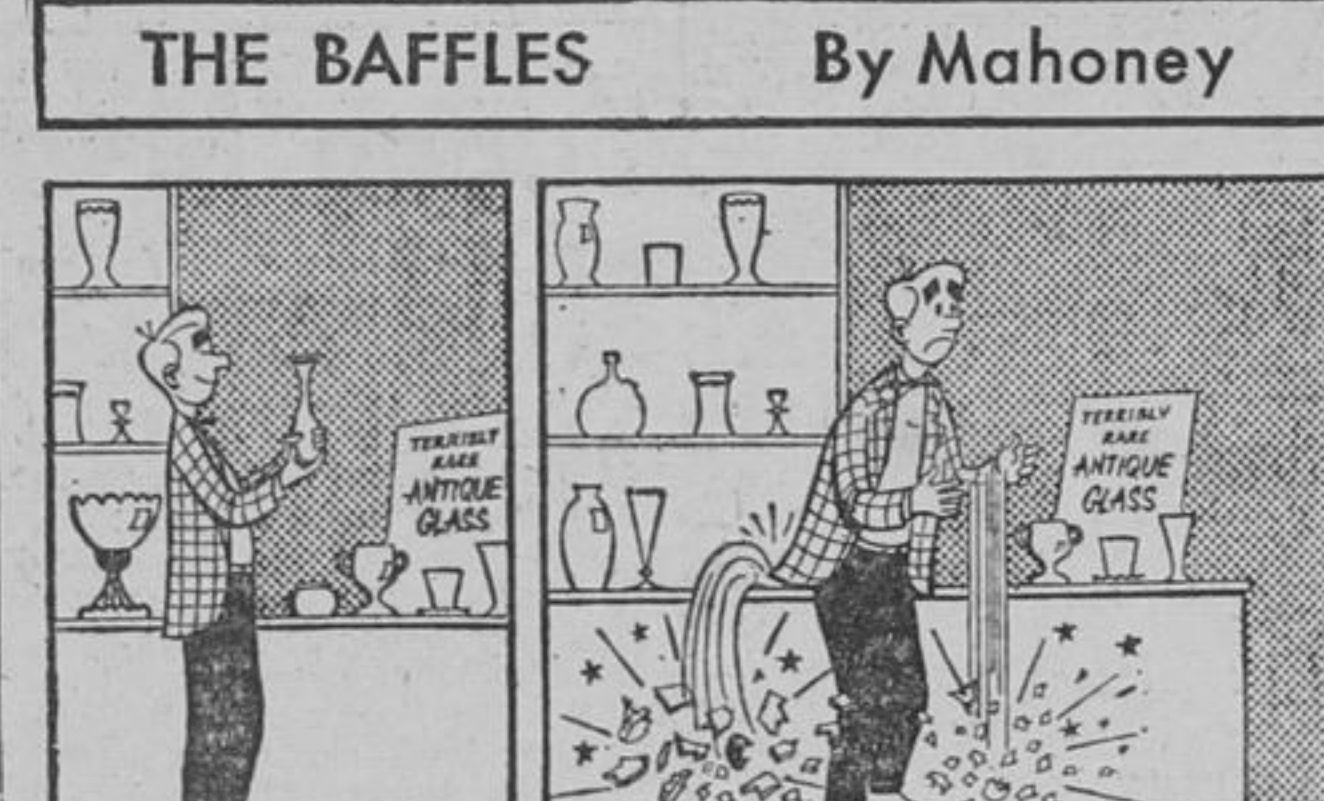
