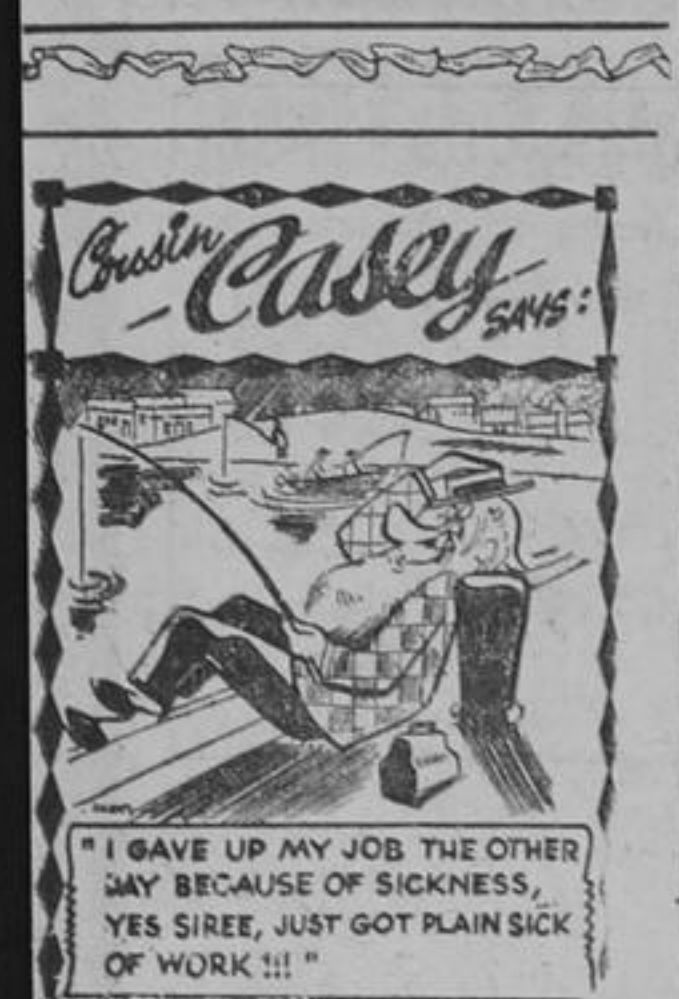

Thornhill House \$500.00 Damage

Quick response by the Richmond Hill Fire Department prevented the fire from spreading in the home of Mr. A. Woolley, Yonge Street, Thornhill, on Monday night. Following the alarm at 6:57 p.m., the Richmond Hill Fire-fighters under Chief Alf Stone found the kitchen at the rear of the house ablaze, but it was speedily brought under control, damage amounting to \$500.

Cause of the fire was attributed to inflammable material in the walls becoming ignited from a blow-torch - used in connection with the installation of plumbing in the kitchen.

Dog Tax Increased

Richmond Hill Town Council, along with councils of Markham and Vaughan Townships, is entering into an agreement for a dog catch and dog pound, and Monday night moved to pass along a share of the cost involved to dog owners in the municipality. It was unanimously agreed to increase the 1959 dog tax by one dollar right across the board.

Annual licence fee for a male dog now will be \$3.00, for the first male dog, and \$5 for each additional male, \$6.00 for the first female and \$9.00 for each additional.

Richmond Hill dog population last year numbered 960.

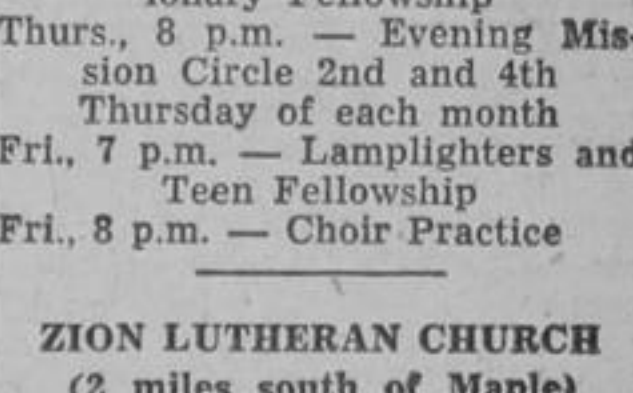
