INFORMS SCHOOL AREA BOARD

C.N.R. Says Pollution & Noise No Problem

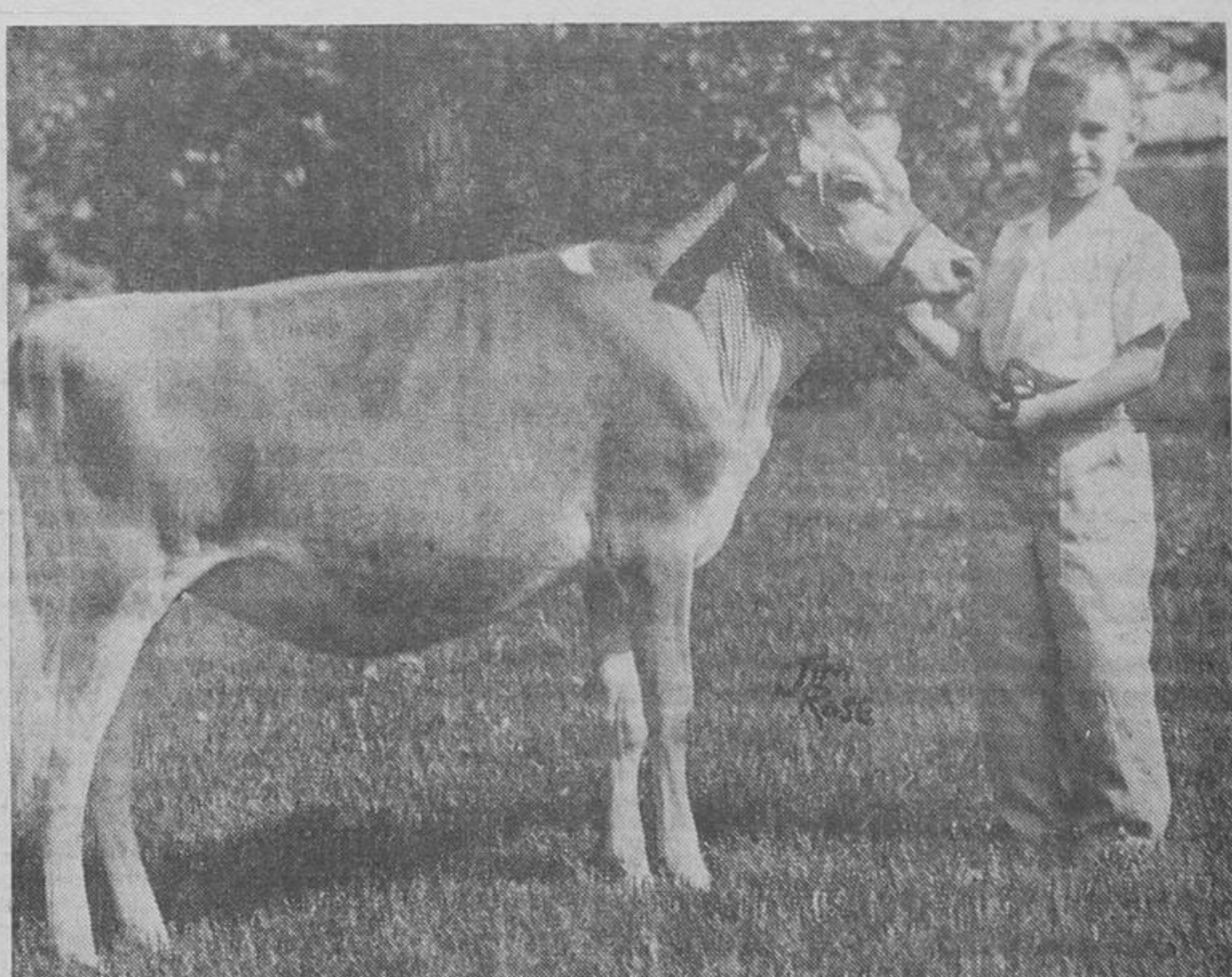
Supervising-Principal and Business Administrator E. J. Sand gave the board of T.S.A. No. 1 Markham and Vaughan Tuesday evening comparison figures for this year and last, regarding average school enrollment. May 1958, with 95.03% present, there were 1970 pupils, in May 1959, with 99.35% on hand, the average for the month came to 2,338 pupils. The board has received a letter from J. J. Cann of the C.N.R. regarding air pollution, safety and noise from the proposed Toronto-by-pass railroad. Mr. Cann pointed out the C.N.R. had conducted extensive tests in a closed area (a tunnel) and found no evidence of toxic fumes. Security fences are to be erected and a program of safety will be issued by the public relations department. He stated Powell Road School shouldn't suffer from too much noise as the railway will be in a 40 foot cut. At a later date the board expects to meet with Mr. Cann and his staff for a further discussion.
