

Repetition may be tiresome, and especially when someone is being read a lecture; yet there are some subjects where it seems inescapable if lessons important to human life are to be driven home. One of these is water safety. As the experts point out, the danger of drowning is greater than many people realize and it can only be warded off through the constant observance of a few simple rules which cover swimming and

So here, once again, is that tiresome but essential list

Don't swim for at least an hour after a heavy meal or after drinking much liquid.

Dont plunge into cold water when overheated.

Don't swim alone out of reach of help; an accompanying boat is essential at any distance from land. Don't dive until sure how deep the water is and whether

it is free of submerged obstructions. Don't venture in small boats without a life-preserver if a non-swimmer.

Don't leave a capsized boat but stay with it until help arrives, because the distance to shore is usually deceptive to the

Don't place trust in inner tubes and the like, for they may go flat. They can also drift far from shore.

Don't play pranks with other swimmers or boaters that may endanger their own safety.

Breaches of one or other of these rules have already led to several tragedies in Ontario this summer. But if every family were to take them to heart the toll from drowning would certainly go down sharply.
