

York County Council

Ont. Municipal Board To Distribute Surplus On 15% Basis To County

A special meeting of York County Council was called for last Friday evening in the council chambers at Newmarket when a report on the hearing of the application of the County of York to the Ontario Municipal Board for adjustment of Assets and Liabilities on the 12th and 14th of August last was given.

11. Murray Yard

The Board order will provide that of the \$50,000 remaining from the sale of this asset, \$25,000, will be credited to the City of Toronto and \$25,000, distributed among the County and the area municipalities in the manner provided in items 1 and 2 above.

12. Eglinton Ave. Extension

The value of this asset was fixed at its cost to the County and the Board ordered that \$6,525 be paid to the remaining County by Metro Toronto as its proportion of the municipal share of the cost of this asset.

13. Debiture Debt re County Roads assumed by Metro, Toronto

The Board's decision was that Metropolitan Toronto should not assume any portion of this debt, but that all road debt should be charged against the County and the 12 area municipalities as provided in item 2. (Debiture debts accrued prior to 1954.)

14. Elidon Hall Park

The proceeds of the sale price of Elidon Hall Park, to the extent of \$142,666.54, shall be considered as a distributable asset to be divided between the County and the Area Municipalities in the manner provided in items 1 and 2.

15. County Buildings

The proceeds of the sale of these buildings (\$425,000) shall be considered as a distributable asset to be divided between the County and the area municipalities in the manner provided in items 1 and 2.

16. South York Registry Office

The valuation of this asset has been determined at \$318,000.00, 65 per cent of the amount payable by Statute by Metro Toronto to the Registry Office no longer serves the Southern Municipalities of the County.)

17. Vivian Forest

The Board will order that this asset remain vested in the County without adjustment in favour of the area municipalities.

18. North York Registry Office

The Board order will provide that this asset remain vested in the County and be adjusted at a value of \$7,000, which will be distributed among the area municipalities in the manner provided in item 2.

19. County Home For the Aged

The Board order will provide that this asset remain vested in the County and be adjusted at a value of \$50,000 which means that 85 per cent of \$50,000 will be distributed among the area municipalities in the manner provided in item 2. The agreement between the area municipalities and the County is supplementary to this order.

20. County of York Pension Plan

The Board order will provide for the vesting of the employer contributions of the County in the seven persons referred to in the Minutes of the Committee dated December 5th, 1957, and will provide that the County will not have to account for the credit of this amount.

Dep-Reeve Tinker Says Beverly Acres Mortgage Probe Publicity Is Bad

Resultant publicity from Richmond Hill's request for legislation to curb second mortgage racketeering has been of doubtful value to the town and especially Beverly Acres. This was the opinion expressed by Deputy-Reeve Stanley F. Tinker at the regular Richmond Hill Town Council meeting Monday night.

16. Interest

The Board ruled that to the extent any surplus monies of the County were used by the County in lieu of borrowing an equivalent amount, the interest which the County would have had to pay be added to the surplus, subject to the following:

(a) No interest is payable for the years 1954 and 1955. (b) The interest terminates June 30, 1959 unless distribution of the surplus is unreasonably delayed. (c) The amount of interest payable in respect of money used to finance the share of Metropolitan Toronto is to be repaid to the County by Metropolitan Toronto.
