### Vaughan Accepts Stewart's Tender

Vaughan Township Council met in a very short session Monday night following a planning board meeting. First item on Council's agenda was the granting of \$100 for the Woodbridge Fair.

E. Stewart's tender for gravel crushing at .64c a cubic yard or .42c a ton was accepted as the lowest bid of the three tenders received. High bid was .65c a ton. The contract calls for the crushing of 25,000 tons of gravel from the Jacob's Gravel Pit at Maple.

Uplands Ave. Extension was deferred for a later meeting of council and a report from Township Engineer Keith Hopper. The Highway No. 7 diversion was put forward on the agenda for next week after Councillor W. Anstey asked for a special meeting with Mr. Hopper regarding the diversion.

Co-ordinating Committee of Richmond Hill, Markham and Vaughan is the official name of the newly formed inter-municipal committee. Each of the three municipalities is contributing \$100 a year to committee funds. The Secretary is to receive \$25. A meeting of the committee was held last night, Wednesday, at Markham Township offices, it will be reported in next week's copy of "The Liberal."

Landscaping of the Municipal grounds will be started as soon as possible in order to provide Fall work for two men.

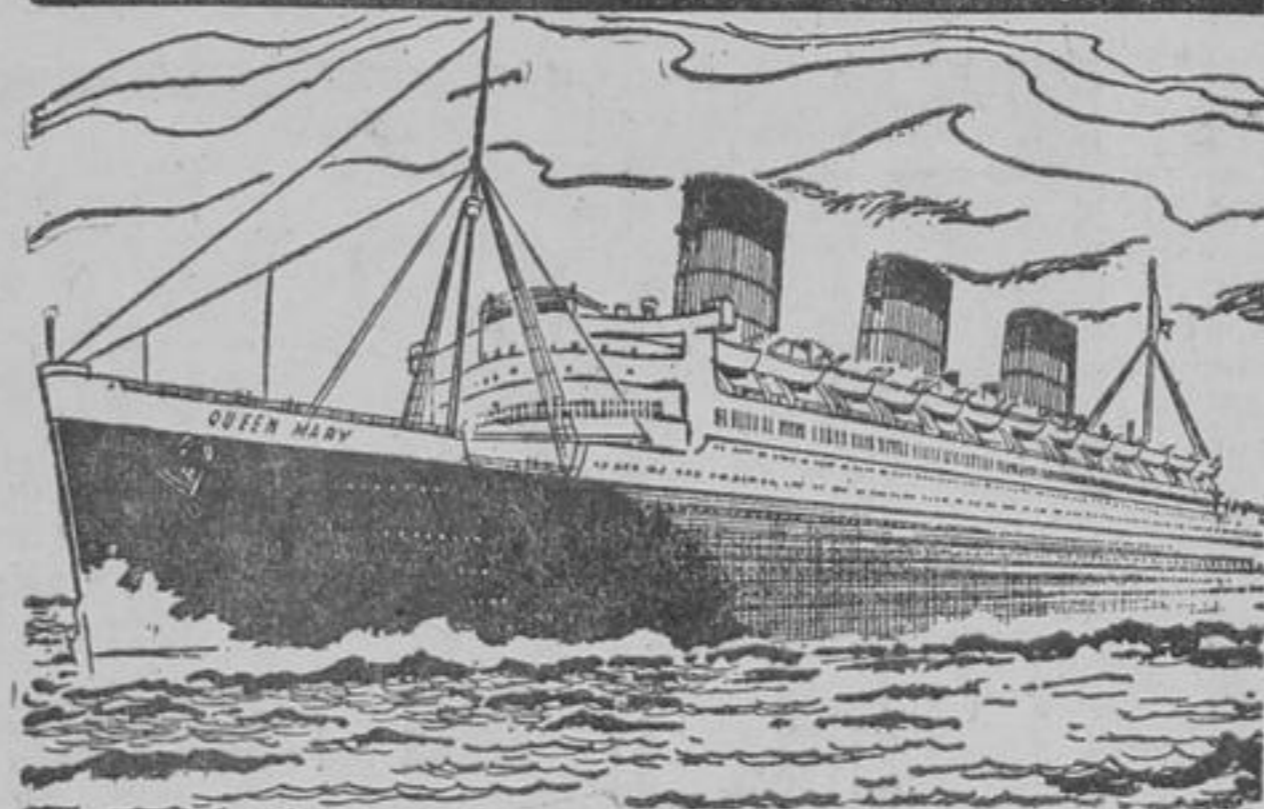
