Open House-Open Hearts

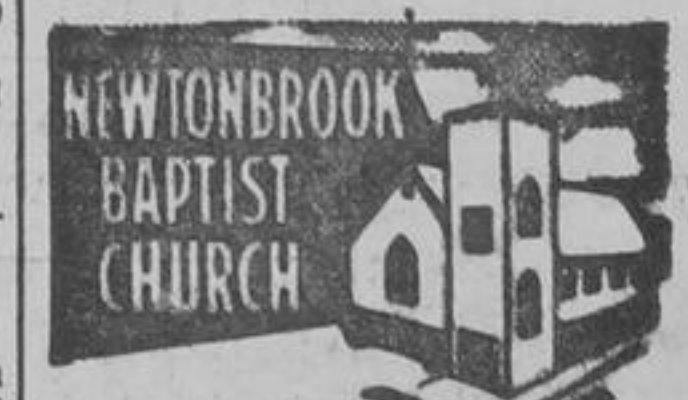

It was 'open house' at the Blackburn home on Yongehurst Road, last Sunday afternoon - as has been the custom over the past 12 years they have resided in their cosy, rambling home.
But last Sunday, September 13, 1959, was more of a special oc- casion as the Blackburns and friends feted Mr. and Mrs. John Robertson of Weston on the oc- casion of their 32nd wedding anniversary. Among the guests who attended and brought 're- membrance gifts' for the happy occasion were, their daughter Sandra Robertson, Mr. and Mrs. C. Walker and son Bruce, the Bill Turner family, Mr. and Mrs. Don Pettiss and family, Mr. and Mrs. Red Ainley and their two children, plus seven members of the Blackburn family.
There was no swimming that day, because of the change in the weather, but the warm September sunshine poured down a blessing of roast turkey, succulent roast pork, done on a spit over charcoal and dripping with barbecue sauce (delicious), hamburgers and hot dogs. All this topped with num- erous desserts, for it is the custom for each family coming to 'open house' to bring along their fa- vorite dishes for all to enjoy.
After supper the youngsters played table tennis, badminton and basketball on the lovely grounds and later the men in the party joined them for a foot- ball 'match'.... Games over they piled big logs on the fire and toasted marshmallows as they finished off a wonderful day.
When we told Marj, Blackburn we would like to do a little feature on the Blackburn 'open house - open hearts' theme, Marj said, "But it's noth- ing. We just enjoy people and love children. There's nothing un- usual enough about our family to be news."
We told her we differed there, for how many families go to the trouble or expense of entertain- ing 'anyone' they know who drops in for a swim or a barbecue sup- per? And who welcomes children to share in the fun too even to the point of providing a pool?
In the spring of 1958 Al Black- burn and sons Bruce, Garry, Bob and Skip, along with Bill Turner, went to work to complete a 17 ft. by 37 ft. swimming pool, for which they had dug the founda- tions and laid the straw floor Thanksgiving weekend of the year before. It took them two months to build the pool in their spare time, but came June of last year and they and the rest of the family and all their friends and neighbours were going in for a dip. Al Blackburn did not stop there either, but built a screen in his cabana while they watched the others swim. Just outside the fenced in pool a clothesline stretches on which are hung nearly two dozen swim suits, in case anyone comes 'without'.
On the picnic grounds, which occupy about an acre of land well protected by shade trees around the grassy slopes, a pet goat is tethered and near at hand grazes a pet lamb; 15 wild mallard ducks parade across the field, or swim in the winding creek, which is crossed in two places by home- made wooden bridges, adding to the picturesque but homey atmos- phere. Nearer the house Pal, their 12 year old Samoyed dog naps and six months old "Lady" plays while Mickey, the cat stalks mice.
As for the house itself - well, it has grown from seven to 10 rooms since the Blackburns took it over in 1947. When they first moved there, after falling in love with the house and grounds on sight, they had three children, all sons, and one was a chosen child. After their arrival, another son
