POPULATION UP 11%

Canada's population increased 198,000 or 1.1% in the first half of this year to reach 17,432,000 at July 1st as compared with 17,234,000 at the beginning of the year, according to the CBS special mid-year estimate. Gains were posted by all provinces. Ontario continued to have the largest numerical growth in population with an increase in the half-year period of 81,000 to 5,965,000 from 5,887,000 at January 1st. Quebec was next, Alberta third and British Columbia fourth. The bureau's population estimates are based on a population accounting which starts with the 1956 census, adds births and immigration, and deducts deaths and an estimate of emigration. Family allowance statistics are used for purposes of estimating inter-provincial migration.
