Concord Water
"Fifty people were present at a meeting on the Concord water situation" Councillor Bruce Ralph told council, Monday night. "Their wells are in poor condition and the people are suffering a water shortage." Councillor Ralph said he advised those present to get petitions so council could determine their needs and the number of people affected. He advised them nothing could be done at the present time, he said.
Reeve Perry said, "There are two things to consider in Concord — there is no money . . . and no water available." Mr. Ralph said he had indicated that to the ratepayers but told them to get the facts so they will be available when water can be piped in.

Pine Grove Water
Six residents on the 7th concession of Vaughan will be supplied with water for two years, Councillor W. Anstey stated. The school at Pine Grove uses a local well for water and Councillor Anstey suggested that the school board should get in touch with Council, "and let us know what they want". Pine Grove has two or three single water services functioning at the present time.
Interest Up
Following O.M.I.C.'s boost in interest rates last Friday from 6 1/2 to 7 per cent, Vaughan Council took steps to remove most of its debentures from O.M.I.C. and will redistribute this balance with a bond company.
